

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Homestead Regulations.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

FOREIGN LIFE IN WINNIPEG

WINNIPEG, Man., July 31.—The application of the deputation of Winnipeg society women to Mayor Sharpe to have the city do something to ameliorate the conditions in the North End, tending to elevate the morals and sanitary conditions in this district, has brought to light a revolting state of affairs among the foreign population, a great part of which is drawn from the slums of great European cities. The protest is said to have taken the form of a request that the foreigners be moved out on the prairie to live in tents or that they be forced to build better and more sanitary houses. The suggestion of tenting on the prairie is also considered an impossible one in health department circles, and it is believed by those officials who are most intimate with the situation, that the clearing up of the dirty district in foreign Winnipeg will only be accomplished by steady work for years by the health department. Conditions that exist between the Canadian Pacific railway tracks and Main street, Selkirk avenue and Robinson street are admitted to be had enough to bring forth protest. Stories often told by health officials of their visits to houses reveal many revolting cases of overcrowding and immortality.

THE WRONG KIND OF FIREFLIES

ST CATHARINES, Ont., July 31.—A peculiar accident befell Edward, the bright little son of Lieut. Col. Geo. C. Thaira, near home on Yates street, Sunday evening, and the fact that he escaped without serious injury is very remarkable. While seated on the verandah he noticed what he surmised to be an extra large number of fire flies about the street and set out to catch one. Soon after he went a cry from him summoned Albert Hatfield to his aid. Instead of catching a firefly Edward had taken hold of a live wire and was held to it by the force of the electricity. Mr Hatfield in rescuing him was severely shocked and was rolled about into the muddy ditch. After several attempts, however, he succeeded in rescuing the boy, whose hands were severely burned. The wire is said to belong to the Bell Telephone Co and to have been charged by coming in contact with a wire of the Lincoln Light, Heat and Power Co.

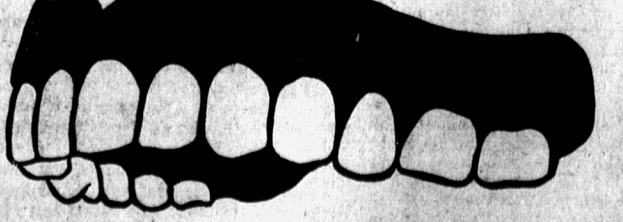
