ALLEGED UNITED SHOE MACHINERY COMPANY IS A COMBINE

BOSTON, Aug. 10—In the suit of the United Shoe Machinery Company to prevent the Thomas G. Plant Company, of this city, from using certain machinery which the machinery company claims infringes on its patents, the Plant Company and Thomas G. Plant, who was made a co-defendant, filed their pleas in the Massachusetts supreme court today. The pleas are practically identical, and set up the claim that the United Shoe Machinery Company is an illegal combination in restraint of trade and that the leases of its machinery to the Plant Company and other shoe manufacturing companies are therefore invalid. The leases in question provide that the concerns using the machine manufactured by the United Company shall not use those of any other manufacturer. As a result of this line of defence, it is expected that the court will go into the details of the combination of shoe machine manufacturing companies into the United Company.

The sheep pens, piggy, horse boxes and poultry houses are alike new and modern. The architectural designs for these structures were made from the best cattle accommodations heretofore standing, with special facilities made possible by the sloping condition of the St. John grounds. The safety and cleanliness of the animals and the convenience of sight-seers have been kept in mind throughout the erection of these buildings.

OHNS TO LIVE IN STATE

NEW YORK, Aug. 9—It will come as a stunning surprise to the families of the fashionable section known as Brooklyn Heights to learn that "Jack" Johnson, the negro champion pugilist of the world, wishes to become a resident of that section, which has maintained its exclusive character for more than a century. Johnson is negotiating for the purchase of a house at the southwest corner of Pierrepont and Henry streets, erected by Herman Behr, a wealthy manufacturer of sandpaper at No. 75 Beekman street, Manhattan, and at present owned by Michael L. McLaughlin, who is supposed to have made several millions in real estate speculation in Brooklyn.

But for the interposition of an automobile accident in Chicago in which his brother was injured, Johnson probably would now be the owner of this choice parcel in Brooklyn. The deal was to have been closed yesterday, the negro pugilist and Baron Wilkins, owner of a Manhattan resort where Johnson makes his New York headquarters, having reached an agreement through telegraphic communication with Edward M. Gillispie, the broker representing Mr. McLaughlin. Johnson was to have come on here from Atlantic City Wednesday night to sign the papers, when he was unexpectedly summoned to Chicago on account of the accident which befell his brother. Wilkins announced yesterday that this would not interfere with the closing of the transaction. The price agreed upon for the property is, it is understood, \$62,500, or about one-half its original cost. At the office of the Realty associates it was stated that the cost of the house and lot complete to Mr. Behr about twenty years ago was about \$120,000. Mr. Gillispie asserts that the house alone cost Mr. Behr \$119,000, and that the plot on which it stands, which is 37.6 x 100, had been assessed at \$50,000. The house is of pressed brick and
