Contract Bridge

Signals

A sound knowledge of signalling is indispensable to anyone who hopes to become a good defensive player. Let's look at a deal in which one of the defenders was woefully weak in this department.

South dealer.
East-West vulnerable.

♠ 8 7 5
♥ 6 4 3
♦ A Q J 9 8
♣ 6 2

♠ J 6 4 3
♥ 10 7 5

The bidding:
South West North East
1♣ Pass 1♦ Pass

South's leap to five clubs over his partner's non-committal diamond response was stretching things, but he "got away with it."

West opened the spade king — and East followed suit with the ace. South might have false-carded with the queen, to discourage a second spade lead, but as it happened, this wasn't necessary. Even though he played, the spade three, West promptly shifted to hearts. South won and ran of three rounds of diamonds, getting rid of his spade queen; and after that he could well afford to concede East his ace of trumps.
