Anglo-Canadian Wheat Agreement Near Completion

By George Kitchen OTTAWA, Jan. 13 - (CP) - The month-long Anglo-Canadian wheat negotiations are believed here to be on the verge of completion and a joint announcement from London and Ottawa is expected shortly, possibly within the next few days. "These are the negotiations aimed at establishing the price the United Kingdom will pay for 140,000,000 bushels of Canadian wheat and wheat flour to be delivered in the 1949-50 crop year under terms of their four-year wheat agreement."

No indication of the new price is available here. The price being paid for current supplies is \$2 a bushel, basis Port William. Port Arthur, Vancouver, and Churchill, Man. Literature And Life By BOOKMAN THE ORDINARY MAN Who was it who said that evidently "God liked ordinary folk because he had made so many of them?" The fact of the matter is that most of us are just ordinary people, and of most importance for they do the larger share of the work of the world. How could we get along at all if the common work of every day were not done - baking our bread, making our clothes, managing our hotels, mining our coal, taking care of our great transportation systems and looking after the thousand and one things that make up our social and national life? You will find that those whom we call the ordinary, every-day people do this.

It is at great Scottish teacher of a generation ago, Dr. A. B. Davidson, in writing about life said to "live an ordinary life well is the greatest of all deeds." It was commenting on Isaiah's words about "mounting like eagles, running and not being weary, and walking and not fainting." He said that soaring, running, walking were not an anti climax. To do well the common things of life, to do them always well - that is hardest. It is just in the way of life that men are most liable to faint. He went on to say that it was the greatest of all powers to be independent of recognition, but it is especially dangerous for one to receive it too soon.

There are lonely areas where life is lived and heroic things done but no Victoria Crosses are given, no plaquettes ever reach the actors but they keep on - these ordinary folk. The weal of the world does not depend on geniuses but rather on those who get out every morning to earn an honest living for those who depend on them. It is not significant that when the Lord of Glory whose birth the Christian world celebrated lately, chose the common lot, earned his bread with hammer, plane and saw in the carpenter's shop. He said and said the Son of man had not where to lay his head. Jonathan Edwards was one of America's greatest men - some say that in intellect possibly he had no superior; but after twenty years serving a congregation he gave up and went to work among the Indians, where he spent six years. He did not feel like a minister who lived down some-where in the soft part of Nova Scotia about 80 years ago. He wrote to the Presbytery of that day that he considered himself too big a man to be buried in such a remote place where one of the members of the congregation moved that some one should be sent down to measure his ears!

When William Carey who was the father of modern missions was called a "rheumatism" he said, "No, I am only coughing." He said Dr. J. H. Hoewert, one of the finest religious teachers of modern times said when speaking to the theological students of a United States college, "When I hear the workmen going down the street in the morning, the sound of the nails in their shoes tells me I should get up and dress and be as diligent at my books as they are at their work in factory or foundry."

I cannot do better than give my readers a bit of what a writer calls the litany of labour - a lovely prayer for a great army of workers.
