STEAM CRANE OFF TRACK.—While in the act of putting in a new railway bridge at Huntley's River, two miles west of Alberton, yesterday, the steam crane toppled over and is now lying by the side of the track. Mr. W. H. Townsend, Bridge and Building Master, with a crew, went up Saturday taking with them the steam crane and other equipment expecting to have the bridge in position for regular traffic Monday morning. The accident will necessitate transferring passengers and mails today. Engineer Scott left Charlottetown yesterday afternoon with two car loads of lumber to build a temporary bridge ready for traffic tonight. Interesting Test With Seed Potatoes

BRAMPTON, Nov. 3.—Interesting experiments carried out by the Department of Agriculture on the farm of George Downey, Alton, have resulted in the following, ten plots being planted with potatoes selected from various parts of the province, and the soil being as nearly similar as possible:

1. Green Mountain, seed from Northern Ontario, 370.4 bushels per acre.
 2. Green Mountain, seed from E. I., 335.5 bushels per acre.
 3. Green Mountains, selected seed from Southern Ontario 338.8 bushels per acre.
 4. Green Mountain, common seed from Southern Ontario, 242 bushels per acre.
 5. Dooley, selected seed from Southern Ontario, 233.6 bushels per acre.
 6. Dooley (Downey's own seed), 74.2 bushels per acre.
 7. Irish Cobblers, seed from Northern Ontario, 233.6 bushels per acre.
 8. Irish Cobblers, seed from P. I., 223.5 bushels per acre.
 9. Irish Cobblers, selected seed from Southern Ontario, 241.4 bushels per acre.
 10. Irish Cobblers common seed from Southern Ontario, 220.7 bushels per acre.
- The seed was planted on June 1st and harvested on October 18. The plants were sprayed four times, July 1, 10, 20 and August 1. Scab was found only where nature had been used, and here were no signs of rot. The Green Mountain variety gave the best yield and the best sample of potatoes. The spray was made of 1 lb. of arsenate of lead powder, 1 lb. Paris Green and 40 gallons of water.

WORLD HONOR HENRI FABRE

NEW YORK, Nov. 2. — Admirers of Henri Fabre, the Provençal naturalist, have revived a campaign started in 1914 but interrupted by the world war to celebrate the hundredth anniversary of his birth and to erect a monument to him at his home, village of Serignan, France. It is proposed to remove Fabre's ashes from the country churchyard and lay them at rest in his own "Harmas," the garden celebrated in his writings as the setting for the greater part of his wonderful studies in the insect world. There the monument will be placed also, under the perpetual care of the government of the republic, which has taken over his old home of Fabre's as a national museum and entomological laboratory. The present movement is under the patronage of M. Millerand, president of the French republic. The chairman of the committee in charge of the project is Henry de La Palloze, Serignan, Vancluse, France.

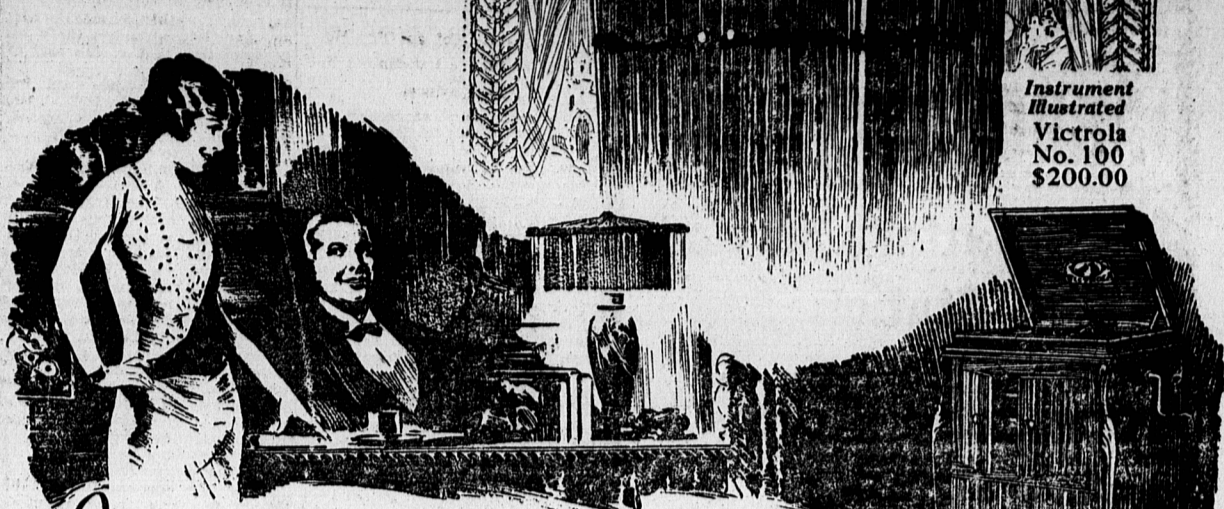

IN MEMORIAM

JOHN DAN MUNRO

On Oct. 15, 1923, John Dan Munro, son of Alexander and Mrs. Munro, Head of Montague, died in the Sanatorium Kentville, N. S., in the twenty-fifth year of his age. At the beginning of the great war he was one of the first to enlist in the 105th regiment from Charlottetown. He was overseas for four years. Near the end of the war while in action a fragment of shrapnel struck him back of his ear and passed through his head coming out between his eyes. He was left on the field for dead, thirty-six hours after the burial party finding him alive he was brought to the hospital. Tennis Sailor May Get Prize

LONDON, Nov. 3.—The name of Alain Gerbault, the French tennis player, who crossed the Atlantic alone in a 30 ft. cutter from Cannes to New York in 142 days, has been proposed for the Annual Grand Prix of the Academie des Sports, which is awarded for what is considered the best sporting exploit of the year. The Grand Prix was established in 1911, and was won by Georges Carpentier, who was awarded 10,000 francs, when he beat Battling Levinsky, thus winning for France the world's light-heavyweight boxing championship. Aviators and explorers figure among the other recipients.

M. P.'s Elected for Life in Guernsey

LONDON, Nov. 3.—A curious situation, not without its comedy, has been created in Guernsey, owing to a strange omission, just discovered, in the law governing the election of deputies to the Guernsey States' local legislature.

It appears that this law, reformed in 1920, omitted to state what is generally understood, that elections are for a term of three years. The next election is due in the new year, so that an amending measure is of immediate importance, because, as the law actually stands at present, deputies appear to be elected for life.

Strangely enough, the slip evaded the notice, not only of the local lawyers, but also the legal advisers to the Privy Council.

UNAUTHORIZED ALTERATIONS

British authors find that a new trouble has recently developed in their lives. To the unkindness of publishers and critics there has been added, according to the manager of one of the largest manuscript type-writing agencies in England, a tendency on the part of the typists to censor manuscripts given them for typing. "The more famous the author happens to be the more alterations will the typists make," said the head of the agency. "The yomit anything they consider meaningless or too sentimental." The strangest part of the story is that instead of being grateful to these young women the writers protest violently over unauthorized alterations.

Rates on Lake Freight Cut

WINNIPEG, Nov. 2.—Since the board of grain commissioners opened negotiations for the return of United States vessels to the Canadian grain carrying trade on October 20, lake freight rates have been practically cut in half. Rates from Port William to Buffalo have declined from six half cents a bushel to three half cents the rate quoted today.
