Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, May 22—(CP)—The stock market slumped to register two new index lows for the year today on the Toronto exchange.

Heavy last-hour trading in the shares of Duquesne Mining Company lifted the aggregate turnover to 217,000 shares, the heaviest in six weeks. Duquesne traded 120,000 shares and closed 1-2-cent up at 11 3/4, stimulated, evidently, by the announcement that the company was financed for a sizable development program.

Losses of 2 to 5 cents were netted by Kit-land-Hudson Bay, Little Long Lac, Preston, Senator Upper Canada and Wright-Hargreaves and Cariboo dropped 19 cents to close at 2.21. McIntyre firmed 3-4 to 47 3/4 and Lake Shore added 1-8.

International Nickel traded in sizable volume with the price down 3-4 finally to 30 and Noranda weakened 1-2 to 49 1/2. In the cheaper group narrow losses appeared for Bend Oreille and Walter Amulet. Chromium firmed 5 cents to 40.

Losses were boarded for Bell Telephone, Consumers Gas, D.S. Millers Seagrams pfd, National Steel Car and Bank of Commerce.

Declines of 1-2-3-4 were netted by Bathurst Power A, Brewers and Distillers, Great Lakes Paper pfd, and Stuart Oils pfd. Monarch Knitting weakened to 10 cents to 50.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, May 22—(CP)—Trading was dull on the stock exchange today, interest being restricted in view of Ascension Day observances. Prices were firm in early transactions but became irregular later on.

Utilities were inclined to sag, Bell Telephone being off more than a point. General Motors, in particular, Montreal Power slipped at the beginning of the session but recovered the lost ground.

Asbestos was a strong spot, in industrials, but Canadian Cement preferred was behind a point and Dominion Coal preferred half a point. In mines, Nickel showed strength at the opening but lost its gain and Noranda was minus a fraction. Dryden advanced, in papers, and St. Lawrence Corporation "A" slipped.

Prices were mixed among the balance of issues boarded. Alcohol "B" was out in front, along with Ogilvie. But Canadian Imperial Tobacco went in the loss column.

Total sales: 8,000 shares; Industrials, 4,200; Mines, 3,800.

NEW YORK, May 22—(AP)—Wall Street today reflected the implications in the war news and leading stocks lost fractions to more than a point.

Canadian issues on the big board generally showed losses, some ranging to over a full point. Distillers Seagram pfd fell 7-8 points to 68 5/8 while Seagram's common was off 1-8. Walkers lost 7-8 and International Nickel 3-8. Only gainer was Dome up 1-4. On the curb, only two issues showed changes, Imperial Oil, off 1-8 and Lake Shore, off 1-4.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 4 of a point at 39.8. Transfers of 401,530 shares compared with 544,200 Wednesday. Sentiment apparently was affected also by a drop in commodities.

Prominent on the losing side were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Crucible Steel, General Motors, Sears Roebuck, U.S. Rubber, J.I. Case, International Harvester, Douglas Aircraft, Anaconda, American Smelting, Westinghouse, Johns-Manville, Phillips Petroleum, Texas Corp., Standard Oil (N) and Climax Molybdenum.

North American, Celanese and American Tobacco "B" slipped to new 1941 lows.

Pullman got up to a new year's top with the gain of a point at 27 7/8. The company after yesterday's close offered to purchase up to 517,241 of its common shares from holders at \$29 a share.

The Prince Edward Island Sheep Breeders' Association again offers its services in assembling the wool clip of the Province for co-operative marketing through the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers, Limited, Toronto.

Prompt payments will be made on a graded basis, when wool has been delivered and graded. Any additional amounts received for the wool after sales have been made by the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers, will be paid at a later date. The sheep breeder is thus assured of the full value for his product. Breeders should take note that the Sheep Breeders' Association sets the price of wool each year. Very often competing agencies buy wool at lower prices at the opening of the season, but conform to the Association's price as soon as it is announced.

This year, wool will be received after May 26th and the week commencing June 16th will be the Big Wool Week in Prince Edward Island. Shipping tags and paper twine are available at the Department of Agriculture, Charlottetown, O'Leary and Montague. Contact Departmental offices for further information.
