MILITARY TRAINING.

TORONTO, Feb. 3.—Lt. Col. Wm. Hamilton Merritt, of the Canadian defence league, claims that the present system of military training in Canada is not only wrong and extravagant, but also practically useless. In an address before the Toronto Board of Trade, quoting from blue books to show that the present system in Canada is wasteful, Col. Merritt said that the cost of the Canadian Permanent Corps, with barracks, maintenance, etc was \$2,106,897 in 1910, as compared with only \$359,763, the cost of the permanent corps, barracks and maintenance in Switzerland for 1910. Furthermore the war strength of the militia was only 57,694 as against 467,054 the war strength of Swiss militia, showing that every trained man in Canada costs the country forty times as much as the trained Swiss soldier costs in Switzerland.
