ARREARS OF TAXES

NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

It is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1907, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of arrears of taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of Arrears of 1926 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same, nor the mailing of Final Notices to Defaulters; and it gives the Government the additional power, after the first month over due, of selling in any Court, and of levying on all debts and chattels found on the premises or in possession of the party taxed. Where there are no goods and chattels, or not sufficient to pay on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

The new Act, as well as the old, declares all taxes to be “Crown debts,” having priority over all other Claims, Judgments, Mortgages, Bills of Sale etc. All Taxes will be sued for in the name of the King.

Persons owing Arrears for Land, Road or Income Tax are required to make immediate payment to save expenses.

—The Express left Summerside for Point du Chene at 10 o'clock yesterday morning, carrying a number of passengers and considerable freight including 1000 lbs quahags, 400 bags of potatoes, a carload of eggs and sixteen horses.

—The Campana arrived at Summerside Sunday morning about seven o'clock, after a somewhat rough voyage. She left Grand River on Friday and found no ice until she reached Miscou Island and West Point where she ran into heavy fields of it. She had the misfortune to lose three blades of one propeller and came into port under one engine. Repairs will be made at Quebec on her return. She had a heavy freight for Summerside and began to discharge Sunday night and did not finish until seven o'clock Monday morning. There were seventy-five passengers aboard on calling from Montreal. Eight of them landed here.
