Liquor Stocks Adequate For Celebration

This Christmas may not equal the rousing yuletide celebration with brimming cup and wassail bowl featured in old prints, but it should come close because for their first peacetime Christmas since 1938 Canadians have adequate stocks of liquor.

Most provinces have either increased or eliminated rations, and the Christmas rush already is under way in liquor stores across Canada. A prescription-plus-permit system this year facilitates the legal purchase of liquor in previously "dry" Prince Edward Island.

In provinces where rations were boosted to take care of the extra holiday demand, liquor purchasers took added cheer from word that the increase will remain in effect until after the Christmas tree is consigned to the ash heap.

Most plentiful potables are rum and gin. Whisky supplies are less abundant, imported Scotch hard to find, but, in general, beer, ale and domestic wines are available in quantities considered "adequate."

A. S. Mahon, chairman of the Nova Scotia Liquor Commission, said stocks are normal for the time. Crowds around liquor stores in Halifax and in other cities and towns are not excessive and no great increases are expected. The Nova Scotia ration is two quarts of rum or whisky or four quarts of gin or three dozen quarts of beer a person each month.

New Brunswick's gin and rum supplies are plentiful and unrationed. Whisky stocks are less abundant, but most vendors have been. In addition to unrestricted quantities of gin and rum, a New Brunswick ration of two quarts of whisky, four bottles of wine and 24 quarts of beer monthly. Liquor store business is brisk but crowds are not unusually large.

A recent amendment to Prince

Edward Island's Prohibition Act permits residents of that island province to buy weekly one quart of whisky, rum or gin, or a case of beer, or two quarts of wine. Lately the supply of beer has been short.

Prince Edward Island's long dry spell ended last Sept. 29 when a Royal Gazette proclamation issued by Lieut-Gov. J. A. Bernard reversed the veto of former Lieut-Gov. B. W. LePage who had refused to assent to a bill passed at the last session of the Provincial Legislature amending the Prohibition Act.

The amendment, passed by a 20-8 vote, permits anyone over 21 years of age to buy a prescription from a doctor for about \$1. When the purchaser takes the prescription to the Attorney-General's Department and pays 25 cents, he obtains a permit. Prescription and permit are good for six months.

Of the varieties of Quebec liquor rationed at 40 ounces a month, the same quantity of Scotch is available this year as last but is still short of demand, and rye, in greater supply, probably will not meet requests. Alcohol (whisky brand) is not available this year.

The Ontario monthly ration allows four bottles of Scotch, rye or gin, but only two bottles may be imported Scotch. Ontario residents may also buy 24 pints of beer and two bottles of wine.

of liquor are plentiful. Officials state supplies in Saskatchewan are adequate to meet the demand. The monthly ration is 52 ounces, consisting of one bottle of rye or Scotch and one bottle of gin or rum.

In Alberta under increased ration privileges, anyone willing to forego whisky may buy four 52-ounce bottles of gin, or three bottles of gin and one of rum, brandy or liqueur. If whisky is purchased, the ration is the same as the regular quota which allows 52 ounces of hard liquor, of which only 26 may be whisky.

British Columbia's December ration is in three categories: 1. One bottle of spirits (Scotch, rye, rum or brandy) plus two bottles of gin and one dozen pints of ale; or, instead of ale, one bottle of Australian sherry if in stock.

2. One gallon of Canadian wine, or two bottles of gin, and 12 pints of ale, or instead of ale, one bottle of Australian sherry if available. If champagne is in stock, one bottle will be classified as two bottles of imported wine.

3. Four dozen pints of beer plus two bottles of gin and one dozen pints of ale, or in lieu of ale, one bottle of Australian sherry if available.

But Quebec Liquor Commission officials announced they have enough unrationed rum and gin to meet all demands. Domestic wines are unrationed and plentiful. Imported wines are in small supply due to transportation difficulties. Beer, unrationed, is reported in short supply.

ECONOMY FRUIT CAKE

3 cups sugar
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon cloves
3 cups water
1 1/2 lbs. seeded raisins
3 tablespoons shortening
4 1/2 cups flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
1/2 cup candied orange peel
1/2 cup citron.

Combine sugar, spices, water and raisins and shortening in a saucepan. Bring to a boil 5 minutes. Cool. Sift together flour, soda, baking powder and salt and add to the cooled mixture. Add chopped citron and candied orange peel. Mix well. Pour into a tube pan 9 inches in diameter by 3 inches high, lined with waxed paper. Bake in a slow oven for about 2 hours.
