MONTHLY MEETING S'SIDE TOWN COUNCIL

The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last evening, the full board with the exception of Councillor MacFarlane being present. The usual number of bills and routine were disposed of. The financial statement for the year was submitted showing the excess of revenue over expenditure to be \$1267.30.

The total cost of the new addition to the school and repairs to the old building amounted to \$23,000. This amount was paid by the issue of debentures and short term loans.

The reports of the year from the Chairmen of the different committees were submitted.

A petition from a number of citizens was presented complaining that the gas escaping from and exhaust pipe of the Electric Light Plant was damaging buildings in the neighborhood and asking the Council to take necessary measures for the protection of the property of the petitioners. The petition was tabled and a committee appointed to report at the next meeting.

A bill for \$90 from Messrs Brace McKay and Company for expense for removing goods from the Montgomery warehouse preparatory to having the building fitted up for the soldiers was referred to a committee of the Council.

The report of the School Board for the past year was read and was the subject for considerable discussion. After some minor matters had been disposed of the Council adjourned.—C.
