COMMISSION HEARS LEADING INTERESTS

Continued from page 1. cent. Mr. Rattenbury argued that higher duty would restore the valuable packing industry here.

was discussed by the Commission, Mr. Mellish, Hon. Wm. Campbell, Mr. Brodie, Mr. Saville and others.

In concluding Mr. Mellish reiterated that, at least as far as P. E. I. was concerned, the farmers were discriminated against in favor of the manufacturer.

George E. Saville was the next speaker. He argued in favor of a lower tariff in order that the farmers might obtain a cheaper raw material.

Robert Carruthers said he believed the sentiment of farmers was for a revenue tariff. The farmers asked no favors but simply fair play.

T. J. Wignington, Peter Brodie, Wm. Campbell, A. B. Warburton discussed the price of farms, the general opinion being that the value had fallen.

THE AFTERNOON SESSION. The Commission re-met at half past two. H. A. Darby was the first speaker.

He strongly supported the farmers resolution pointing out that the agricultural population were generally in poor circumstances owing to the heavy duties on their raw material.

He asked that the tariff be framed in the interests of the farmers and in the interests of manufacturers as well.

Peter Brodie asked for a higher duty on poor seeds and a lower duty on better seeds. Prices went up in agricultural implements during the past few years.

As an auctioneer quoted a number of examples to show the depreciation of land in this part of the Island and asked for higher duty on starch and a lower duty on kerosene oil.

Donald Nicholson asked for uniform stamp on tobacco and higher duty on imported weed.

T. B. Riley found Island soil excellent for growing tobacco but he could not successfully grow the plant as help could not be procured and there was a prejudice against Island tobacco.

Mr. Brodie said he would recommend to the minister of agriculture that the expert soon to come to Canada visit Prince Edward Island.

Horace Hazard dissented from statements that farmers were unable to make living here. Many were leaving because of an increase of the price of wheat.

George E. Full proposed that the millions would soon be in the North west and the influence of the Maritime Provinces would be small.

Mr. Fielding said that he thought something should be done in directing immigrants to the Maritime Provinces.

Isaac Essery, Union Road, asked that the farmers be left severely alone. He urged that the Protective tariff wall be thrown down and remarked if Prohibition were given all tariff restrictions might be abolished and the country would prosper.

The Commission then adjourned after Mr. Fielding had thanked the local government for placing the room at their disposal.
