LONDON, October 21. (British United Press)—Analysis in cold figures of the marvellous racing exploits of the marvellous racing machines which secured Great Britain permanent possession of the coveted Schneider International trophy and far surpassed all previous speed records destroys nothing of the glamour surrounding these miracles of engineering.

The intercollegiate game between Saint Dunstan's and Prince of Wales, which was to have taken place yesterday, was postponed until Monday.

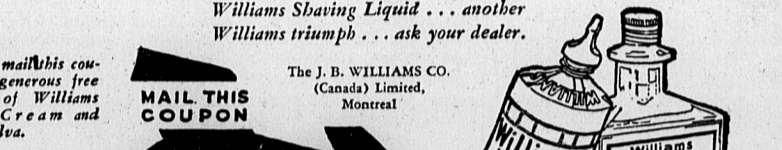

The whole truth is that, for the last fifteen years they have been slaughtering Canadian-bred birds, using every means and appliance, killing them off by the million.

and lesser yellow legs? Was this Province ever consulted? I don't think so.

This is not the case in the States. I have at hand all the acts (the old as well as the new), of the U. S. migratory bird laws. There, before they make any amendments, the different states are consulted. Not so with us.

In my thirty-six years gunning experience, I have known of three cases similar to "Island Sportsman's" experience, and strange to say those miracles were all experienced by bird wardens usually looking for promotion. I hope it is not so in this case.

When you consider the United States with a population of thirteen and one third times that of Canada, entering into a treaty on almost the same basis (and if there was any break the Yankees had it on their side). Why did the Americans allow their sportsmen to use automatic shot guns when they were barred in Canada, where our sportsmen are few, compared with those of the States?

Who put a close season on plover? and a year or two later on greater

sure made a drastic reduction.

In bringing this letter to a close I may state that I sincerely believe in the protection of migratory birds and to do this we must start in the States first.

"Island Sportsman" seems to think they have done wonderful, and apparently would like to see them keep on killing the birds off by the millions. In conclusion, let me say that the States put it all over Canada in the first place, and today Canada is a bird sanctuary for the States.

Let "Island Sportsman" call this parrot talk as he did in his first letter. Will he dare call Jack Miner's statements parrot talk? Some of them were published in the Guardian recently.

We will await what he says in his next effort regarding ignorance and parrot fashion. In a short while I will give your readers some information from the game laws of the different provinces of Canada, especially those suffering from drought.
