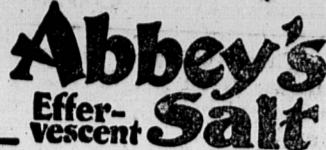

CALGARY, Alb., April 5—This city is roused over speculation in lands resulting from somebody getting tips. On March 26, Darcy Tate, solicitor for the G. T. P. of this city, approved the general location route map for the Grand Trunk's entry into Calgary, the first official document of this nature that has been received. Real estate men evidently saw the map the city received before it was made public, and got options on the right of way. The map should have been laid before the city council's last session on Tuesday. Mayor Jamieson's only explanation for the papers not being given to council was that he had seen them, but had done nothing with them.

RICH CRIMINAL CAPTURED.

NEW YORK, April 5—Frederick Cunningham, who was arrested here last night after a desperate battle with one of the men who robbed the Richmond, Va., post office of \$85,000 worth of stamps and cash, was today identified as Eddie Fay, one of the most desperate criminals in the country. Cunningham (Fay) is described by the detective bureau as one of the most desperate criminals in the world. It is said to be wanting in more than a dozen states for safe blowing, jail breaking and murder. He is said to possess half a million dollars. Cunningham insists that he is a banker and broker, of London, England.

TELEPHONE TRUST.

NEW YORK, April 5—The telephone trust, the second largest trust in the world, it being outranked only by the United States Steel Corporation, came into legal existence today, when there was filed with Secretary of State Koenig at Albany a certificate of an increase in the capital stock of the American Telephone and Telegraph Co. from \$200,000,000 to \$500,000,000. After Mr. Koenig had accepted the papers a cheque for \$10,000—the state tax—was sent to the state treasurer by the officers of the company.

LONDON, April 5—The rumors are revived that Earl Carrington will be the next Governor-General of Canada, but they are authoritatively denied as Carrington cannot be spared from the board of agriculture.

ROBBER ENTERED HOUSE AND SHOT TWO WOMEN.

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., April 5—Although four suspects are held in the central station on suspicion of having guilty knowledge of the murder of Miss Martha B. Blackstone, 30, and the serious wounding of Miss Harriet Dow, 25, at the Dow home, on Round Hill, the fashionable section of Springfield, it is by no means certain that the guilty man is included.

Mrs. Sarah K. Dow, her two daughters, Harriet and Lucy, and Miss Blackstone were seated at a table in the parlor, when a masked man walked in from an adjoining room. He had an automatic revolver in his hand, which he pointed at them, and demanded money. Mrs. Dow gasped out that she had no money, but Miss Blackstone commenced screaming, and started to run from the room. As she did so she was fired at, the bullet entering her left breast and penetrating her heart. She then fled toward the prostrate Miss Blackstone, the bullet striking her in the left side of the head. Miss Dow is now in the hospital, and it was stated by the physicians today that she will likely recover.

The police have ordered all unknown men found in the city to be rounded up and compelled to give an account of themselves, while all surrounding towns have been asked to aid in the round-up.
