IN THE FAR EAST.

While the Emperor of Germany is, as we noted yesterday, growing a beard, the statesmen of China are engaged in what is there known as "saving the Emperor's face." This means saving his credit saving him from chagrin, and putting the best face upon what has happened within the past few years. Of course there are the facts that the Emperor at one time was strongly committed to the reform party, and was forced by the Empress Dowager and the reactionists to practically become a prisoner in his own palace, while the leading reformers were beheaded, or compelled to fly for their lives. More recently came the Boxer rising the invasion by the powers, the occupation of Peking and the flight of Empress and Emperor. To make pleasant reading of all this is not easy from the Chinese standpoint but still something can be done in the way of "saving the face."

Among the things that have happened has been the suspension of civil service examinations in cities where the foreigners were massacred and this requires to be glossed over. Then even in China, there is a curiosity as to the relations between the Emperor and the Empress Dowager, the fact being that while things are done in the Emperor's name the Dowager is the real executive head. Something has to be done or said to save her face as well as his, and this was attempted in an edict issued some months ago. This was issued in the name of the Emperor and opens with a delightfully delicate reference to his flight and subsequent reflections:

"Since our departure westward the Empress Dowager has labored night and day, and I, the Emperor have bitterly reproached myself and reflected on the heaped-up abuses of the last score years, resulting in the continuous prostration which has aimed only at a fair exterior and culminated in the present serious war." "Our departure westward," is good, and the reference to needed reforms shows the existing necessity of again conciliating the reformers, notwithstanding that they had been execrated in successive edicts before issued. We can easily see the hand of the Empress Dowager herself in what follows:

"The rebel in question (Kang Yu Wei) and his followers took advantage of my weak state of health to aim at treasonable schemes, and I earnestly entreated the Empress Dowager to take up the government. Thus did she save me when on the brink of danger, and in one day root out the traitors. While she has utterly destroyed the rebellions, the Empress has never failed to introduce new methods, and while I have examined wherein lay loss and gain I have never thought of laying old customs aside in their entirety. I have held to the mean in governing, and followed what was good, my heart in union with my mother, to the joy of officers and people."

So the Emperor has returned to his capital where all traces of the foreign bombardment and occupation are being obliterated, and everything made to look as much like it was before as possible. Both he and the Empress Dowager, between whom there is a love as kindly as the fisherman has for the worm, are now in favor of reform—in moderation. Like true conservatives they will lop away some mouldering branches from the national tree, but will not proceed to very radical measures. It is all very pretty and illustrates the ways of rulers in the Orient.

AN AWFUL FOREST FIRE.

STOCKHOLM July 29.—A forest fire in the province of Jemtland has assumed gigantic proportions. Three thousand troops have been ordered to assist the men who are combatting the flames. The hot weather continues here.
