**Private G.J. Rowe Wins Patterson Cup**

First Range of Governor-General's Match—The Riflemen Ask for an Increase in the Size of the Range At Ottawa.

OTTAWA, August 27.—The shooting at the D. R. A. today was carried out under a clear sky, but in a deceptive and strong mirage. The morning was occupied by the Dominion match for the Patterson cup and \$811 added by the D. R. A. The match is shot off 600 and 800 yards. Seven shots at each, making the possible 70. In the afternoon the first stage of the governor-general's match was begun. The first range, 200 yards, being shot off. The stage does not conclude till Thursday.

The annual competitors or "kickers" meeting of the D. R. A. was held here this evening under the presidency of Lieutenant-Colonel Sam Hughes, president of the association. His opening address was brief and general. The most important suggestion by the competitors was that the size of the range be increased by from 25 to 40 targets. This has been found a necessity at this season, owing to the increased number of competitors, and it has been found very difficult to provide targets for the shooting of the extra series competitions concurrently with the regular matches. Other suggestions were in regard to details of slabs, rifles and messing at the ranges. If the suggestion regarding the increased size of the ranges were carried out, it would make the increased size of the ranges one of from eighty to nearly a hundred targets.
