PROTECT THE DOGS—Friends of dogs, who object to vivisection, have a new ally in Dr. William Mayo, the famous surgeon of Rochester, Minn., who told the Boston

Surgical Society, on June 6, that if they wished to continue to have the benefits of animal experimentation, which have resulted, he said, in "gifts of inestimable value to humanity," they must protect the dog from wanton experimentation. "It is undoubtedly true," Dr. Mayo said, "that opposition to animal experimentation has been brought about by physicians themselves. For at least four thousand years the dog has been man's friend and companion, and the practice of buying stolen family pets at small prices for animal experimentation has alienated the public." THE U. S. BANISHES "COUNT" GREGORY.—Telling a story of squandered millions and wasted opportunities. Count Michael de Guinebaum of the Australian nobility, who in every-day life is known as Bernard F. Gregory, pleaded guilty to a charge of larceny in the first degree before Judge Rosalby in the Court of General Sessions, and received a suspended sentence with banishment from the United States. Count Michael is 73 years old, and lives at the Cosmopolitan Hotel. His sister, Lady Biddulph, lives in London. A few years ago, he claims, they inherited a fortune of between \$4,000,000 and \$5,000,000 from their father, who was a street car magnate in Australia. The aged man told the court that

he squandered his inheritance in Wall street speculations, at the race track and in dealings in blood ed stock. In the past eight years he said, he had been convicted four times. After his fortune was dissipated he made a livelihood by writing on sport topics for the newspapers.

G.T.R. Men Accept Reduction

MONTREAL, Que., Oct. 27.—A tentative agreement was reached today between the employees of the Grand Trunk Railway and representatives of the Company, whereby the men agree to accept provisionally the reduction of wages with the understanding that further negotiations alter the schedules of pay the company will see that any back money withheld is refunded. The agreement as it is in a general way is that the employees accept the reduction of rates of pay put into effect in July last, subject to adjustment of any inequalities. The agreement was also subject to a re-opening of the whole question of wage rates of fifteen days notice from either side when any further reconsideration would be taken up by representatives of the company and the employees. The reduction is approximately to twelve and half per cent.

Miners to Resist A Wage Cut

SYDNEY, N. S. Oct. 27.—When asked today if he would reply to the statement of Mr. Wolvine, resident of the Dominion Steel Corporation that wages must drop or the coal mines and steel plant operated by this corporation would have to close, J. B. McLachlan, secretary of the United Mine Workers of America, J. B. McLachlan, Secretary of the United Mine workers of America district 26 said he wanted to talk to the President across a conference table. There is nothing to be gained by carrying on a long distance debate in the newspapers he added, Robert Baxter, district President, reaffirmed Mr. McLaughlin's former statement that the United Mine Workers would resist any wage cut.

LONDON, Oct. 27.—The Prince of Wales left Victoria station at noon yesterday for Portsmouth to embark on the battle cruiser Renown, for a tour of India. Great crowds outside the station gave the Prince an enthusiastic sendoff, while on the platform were the king and Queen, Princes and Lloyd George. Several members of the British cabinet, United States Ambassador Harvey, Japanese Ambassador Hayashi, and other distinguished personages. The leave taking of the royal family presented a touching scene.
