GREATEST PALACE IN TURKEY

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 2 (Special)—The Beylerbey Palace, to which the ex-Sultan Abdul Hamid has been removed, is generally regarded as the most successful architectural achievement of modern times in Turkey. It was built at Abdul-Azis in 1566, and is of white marble throughout, and essentially Oriental in every respect.

During his reign Abdul Hamid never resided at the Beylerbey Palace, perhaps because of its association with the tragic death of his uncle Aziz, but foreign Sovereigns visiting Constantinople were always entertained there. The artistic loveliness of the Palace delighted the Empress Eugenie on the occasion of her visit in 1869, though the rooms set apart for her use were furnished to exactly resemble her suite of apartments in the Tuilleries.

TEACHERS SCARCE IN GREAT BRITAIN

LONDON, Dec. 2 (Special)—Complaints continue to be made here about the death of teachers for elementary schools. The number of young entrants to the profession has steadily declined in London from 1,181 in the year 1908 to 365 this year; while if boys alone are taken, the number has declined from 263 to 30. In all London only thirty boys could be got this year to enter teaching as a profession. The sub-committee of the London County Council which reported on the matter said that some part of the decline was due to the unemployed teachers' agitation of a few years back, but they seemed inclined to attribute most of it to the period of good trade through which the country has recently been passing. The real reason, of course, the pay. A married male teacher in London with a family has a pretty tight struggle unless he ekes out his salary by teaching in the evening schools or doing other extra work.

PROGRESS OF THE WAR SITUATION

THE END OF HOUSE OF TIMUR

CALCUTTA, Dec. 2 (Special)—It is fifty years since the last of the Moslem Kings of Delhi, the degenerate descendant of the Moghul Emperors, died in exile at Rangoon. The records of the Indian Mutiny contain few more terrible chapters than the story of Hodson, of Hodson's Horse, hunting down the King of Delhi, after the capture of the city, taking him prisoner at the Emperor's Humayun's tomb, and shooting the Princess with his own hand after they had surrendered. The wretched old King, Bahadur Shah, who, as the titular Emperor of Hindustan, had been made by the Sepoys the figure-head of the rebellion, was tried on the charge of treason, amid a public clamor for his execution, which happily was ineffectual.

The trial took place in the Delhi Fort. An eye-witness has described how he saw, in the beautiful Hall of Audience, the last of the Moghuls crushed before the Court, "dressed in a piece of sack, and a coarse turban like a coolie." Lord Dalhousie, the great Governor-General, who had proposed some years before the Mutiny that the sham sovereignty should be declared at an end with Bahadur Shah, considered it a fortunate thing that the King was not put to death.

To have hanged as a felon (he wrote) an aged man of 85, a crowned King, and the head of the Moslems in India, would have disgusted our best friends, and they are still many among the Mussulmans of the East, and would have produced a revulsion of feeling against us both in Europe and Asia.

He was banished to Burma, lived five years in captivity, and died on November 7, 1862, thus ending, as Dalhousie put it, the house of Timur.

Greeks Occupy Important Island—Terms of Peace to be Signed. Greeks Seek Refuge

(Canadian Press) ROME, December 2—The occupation by the Greeks of a small island of Sazono at the entrance of the Gulf of Arizona will be feared cause complications, as Italy and Austria have agreed to prevent such a step by force if necessary.

(Canadian Press) LONDON, Dec. 2—The terms of peace and armistice which will be signed Tuesday will provide armies that shall remain in their present position and cease entrenching reinforcing or bringing up ammunition.

The Adriatic and Scutari shall not be evacuated but the garrisons shall receive rations daily.

(Canadian Press) ATHENS, Dec. 2—According to a statement at Soloniki 180 Greeks took refuge at mosque in a village of Marova and were killed by Turkish troops. Turks also destroyed many villages.

(Canadian Press) CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 2—The signing of the Protocol of the armistice has been postponed to Tuesday to give the representatives all allies an opportunity to sign.

THE SEASON IN BERLIN

BERLIN, Dec. 2 (Special)—Preparations for a "season" next summer on the London model have not deterred Berlin from rushing pell mell into their regular season, which finds itself in full blast with the opening of November. From now till the close of the annual court festivities, at the beginning of Lent, there will be one relentless round of gaieties. The five o'clock tea habit is now settled in Berlin. The big hotels-de-luxe are crowded every afternoon, and dozens of coffee-houses in all parts of the town have introduced "five o'clocks" to accommodate the overflow. The Charity Bazaar mode promises to be more rife than ever. The Princess of Pless, a prime favorite in Berlin Society, started the bazaar ball rolling with a big function at the Zoological Gardens. Entertaining at hotels is becoming increasingly the vogue. Only the barest handful of German society folk maintain houses in Berlin, and they simply camp out for the winter season in apartments at the public caravanseries. (Canadian Press) TOKIO, Dec. 2—The Cabinet crisis has arisen over a refusal by the Minister of War to accept the cabinet decision rejecting his scheme for increasing the military forces at Korea.

PRINCES WRITES COMIC OPERA

VIENNA, Dec. 2 (Special)—Some details of the libretto of the comic opera which the ex-Crown Princess of Saxony is writing in conjunction with her present husband have leaked out. She will play the leading part, Princess Flora, wife of a Crown Prince, herself, it is said. Her former husband, now Frederick of Saxony, Giron, and other men and women who have figured in her life, are in the opera, too, very thinly disguised and easily recognizable. The first act represents the popular German festival called "Vogelblessen," or the Wooden Bird; the second act takes place in a studio, while the third represents the gloomy reception room of a royal palace. This act is entirely devoted to a satire of Court personages and of Court customs and morals. The opera will be produced in Paris and Rome.
