If the fan belt is slipping a little and there are no tools with which to raise the pulley it is a good plan to sandpaper the inside of the belt. This cleans off any grease that might cause it to slip and gives it better traction on the pulleys.

THIS SAVES ONE GUESS

Much trouble shooting about a car is guessing. One often has to experiment quite a bit before striking the right answer. But you can save one guess if the dimmers or headlights of both lamps go dead at the same time. Don't bother to remove the lenses to see whether the lights are burned out. The trouble is due to a short connection where along the line to poor switch contacts, blown fuses or to interruption of the current by reason of the circuit breaker.

EASES THE SHOCK

When going over rough spots in the road it will ease the shock to the feed gas with the hand control while gently applying the brakes. The idea is that under this arrangement the car pulls when going into the holes and when drawing out of them, yet without coasting into them with a jolt. By keeping the speed of the car constant the jolts are reduced to a minimum.
