New Dehydration Plant Underway

First Potatoes Processed At New Summerside Plant Yesterday.

The first potatoes ever to be dehydrated on Prince Edward Island went through the process yesterday at the new dehydration plant at Summerside, which is owned and operated by Island Foods Incorporated. The opening of this plant has been delayed for some time due to the late arrival of the machinery. Only a few potatoes were processed yesterday and until the experimental stage is over only small quantities will be used. However it is hoped to get into substantial production shortly. To the Hon. T. O. Campbell, must go the credit for bringing this plant to this province, as by his efforts and energy in this regard, the decision was made to establish a plant here. The president of Island Foods Inc. is Mr. Austin A. Seaton, Freeport, a well known potato man. The secretary is Mr. L. R. Allan, Summerside. The plant manager is Mr. Arthur Lewis of Charlottetown.

It is expected that when in full production this plant will need about sixty employees, and that operations will be carried on about eight months every year. When the potatoes begin to sprout and become soft it is not possible to dehydrate them. About the end of May the plant will probably close down until the new potatoes are ready in the fall. All the output of this plant will be taken by the British Ministry of Food and shipped overseas, or carried by sea to other countries. It is expected that this industry will continue to flourish as there will be many peacetime demands for this interesting incident occurred at the annual supper of the Summerside Board of Trade held last winter. Dehydrated potatoes were served to some of the guests, and until told of the fact they were entirely unaware of it, having found no difference in the taste.—S.

True Bills In S'Side Conspiracy Cases

Special Session Of Supreme Court Adjourns Until October.

The special session of the Supreme Court which had been adjourned since April 7, convened yesterday at the Court House, Summerside, with Mr. Justice A.C. Saunders presiding. The cases were brought in against John (Holman) Gallant, Andrew Perry and Clovis Perry. The charges were that they conspired to defraud the Government of Excise duties and the tax in respect to alcohol as well as when manufactured in Canada. In the case of Clovis Perry there was a third charge, that of having in his possession in his dwelling house wash suitable for the manufacture of spirits contrary to the Excise Act. His Lordship addressed the Grand Jury with reference to these charges, defining conspiracy and going over the evidence for their benefit. At the conclusion of the sitting court was adjourned till October 28. His Lordship stated the reason for the long adjournment was that it would be inconvenient
