The volume of business for 1,004 wholesalers proper in the city of Montreal amounted to \$283,286,100 for the year 1930. These establishments employed 12,289 persons (including full-time and part-time employees and proprietors) and firm members drawing a fixed salary) who received \$19,018,500 as salaries and wages. The value of stocks on hand in these establishments at the end of 1930 amounted to \$36,605,000.

Then follow, 51 dealers in fuel and metal products with sales of \$23,314,600; 23 wholesalers of paper and paper products with sales of \$20,347,700; 62 dealers in farm products and supplies reporting a business of \$13,340,700. The sales for machinery, equipment and supplies were \$13,311,400, reported by 84 wholesalers.

### Clover and Grass Seed Production

Returns indicate that clovers and alfalfa in 1932 promise a much smaller total yield of seed in Canada than last year, while more timothy and blue grass is in prospect. Alfalfa prospects are poor, as the first cut failed to set seed in Ontario and a short crop is expected in southern Alberta. Alfalfa is much reduced in acreage in Ontario and may yield under average. A considerably reduced acreage of sweet clover for seed is reported in the western provinces and also in Ontario. Brome and western rye grass in the western provinces promise much more seed than last year owing to more moisture during the growing season. The acreage of bent grass for seed in Prince Edward Island is reported about 21 per cent less than last year.
