HALIFAX, Mar. 30.—With one thousand of their number totally out of work and eleven thousand out of half-time and many less than that, a meeting of the executive of the United Mine Workers of America, District 26, who are in session here are receiving reports from various districts which indicate serious conditions. President Baxter stated last night that conditions in the coal mining industry of the Maritime Provinces is very bad. He said appeals for help were taxing the organization considerably. Efforts are being made to arrange a conference with the local government on the unemployment situation.
