The Eyes Need Home Care

"Think young thoughts and your eyes will keep their youth."

But eyes need help, the sort of home care that only you can give them. They like to be thought about occasionally, to receive a few gentle attentions. Give them such assistance and they will sparkle all through life and keep you sparkling, too.

They respond to such pampering as this: Give your eyes a bath morning and night. Mornings, to wash away possible secretions, to freshen and stimulate them for the day. Cleanse them at bedtime from the dust and grime of the day and to relax them for rest. To prepare them, too, for possible gentle ministrations—some of which will follow—so that they are physically fit.

A simple wash is made by adding one teaspoonful of refined table salt to one pint of water. Apply the wash in one of several ways: by using two eye cups at the same time; by applying it warm on twin pads of cotton wool, followed by a cold water splash; or to tone eye muscles and to help eye gleam; or you may use a dropper for application.

Important though in such eye hygienic measures are the following: (3) Do not fail to sterilize eye cups before using. (2) If you use but one eye cup, which you will, you will, be sure to sterilize it before using it on the other eye. (3) It is mistaken thrift to pour back into the bottle eyewash which has been used.
