Losses Swamp Gains On Montreal Market

MONTREAL, Nov. 21 (CP)—Losses swamped gains in transactions today on the stock exchange as a change and curb market while fair quota of issues moved sideways. All key groups were off in the indices except golds and banks which were unchanged. Turnover was light.

Weaker in papers were International off 2. Price, down 1-2. Abitibi Common and Preferred, Donnacoma, Brown Stocks, Donohue, Eddy "A", Bathurst, St. Lawrence "A" and M. and O. Consolidated switched from the loss to the win column. St. Lawrence Paper Preferred was also better and B. C. Forest did not retain a lift.

Softer in industrials were Dusco, D. Coal Preferred, C. Industries, Westinghouse, C. Car Common and "A", Electrolux, Ford, Massey, N. S. O. Cement, M. and C. Loco, Asbestos and Forgings "A", Agnew, Acadia, "A" and R. Mitchell pushed up. Dominion Textile was higher and Bruck and Colanese sagged in Textiles. In Beverages, Brewsters and Distillers and Labatt were firmer and easier were Seagram's, C. Breweries, Alico "A", Steaks, Walker and Melcher, Commercial Alico was off.

On the downside in utilities were Bell, Shawinigan, B. C. Power, Winnipeg Electric, Montreal Power, Ottawa Power and U. Utilities, Power Corporation and Brazilian wiped out. Jefeits, Commerce, Montreal and Royal retreated in banks. C.P.R. and P. Transport lagged in carriers.

In higher ground in miscellaneous were Lake of the Woods, following publication of the company's annual report showing increased earnings. Famous Players, Silk and David "B" Printed, Gen. Westing, C. Cable and "B", Zellers, Catell, Chemicals, Lewis and Drane.

N.Y. Stock Market Suffers Late Reverse

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP)—The stock market suffered a sharp late relapse today under heavy selling ascribed to growing pessimism over the outlook for the nation's coal mines and the resultant serious threat to industry.

Led by liquors, Canadian issues registered substantial declines. Distillers Seagram dropped 3-4 and Hiram Walker 3-8. Canadian Pacific slipped 1-4 and Dome Mines 1-8. On the Curb, Lake Shore eased 1-8.

Casualties included Eastman Kodak, off 5 points at 210 on 300 shares; John-Manville 4 at 122, Steel 3 1-4 at 30 (when directors took no action on a dividend) Bethlehem 2 1-8 at 87 1-2, Chrysler 2 1-2 at 80 1-8 and Southern Railway 2 at 37 1-2.

On the downside were U. S. Steel, General Motors, Goodrich Goodyear, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, North American, Ancoand, Cerro de Pasco, American Smelting, American Can, Dow Chemical, Du Pont, Allied Chemical, Santa Fe, Southern Pacific, Northern Pacific, Schenley, Texas Co. and Standard Oil (N.J.).

American Telephone was up a point at one time and ended with a net gain of 1-4 at 190 1-4. Small advances were retained by International Harvester and Loew's.

New Income Tax Tables Are Being Distributed

OTTAWA, Nov. 20 (CP)—Distribution of 1947 personal income tax tables to employers across the dominion has started and should be completed by the end of the week, a revenue department official said today.

They embody the tax changes announced by Finance Minister Dingley last spring when his budget forecast an average 12 to 15 per cent reduction for roughly 1,000,000 taxpayers. Accompanying them are copies of tax form "D.T.1" for use by married employees and single employees with dependents. It now is simplified to a single sheet.

The tables will prepare employers for deductions at the source beginning Jan. 1, 1947.

The appearance of the tables coincided roughly with the department's decision to replace the present income tax tables with the new tables.
