THE death occurred last Sunday evening at Kensington, of Mrs. James Whitehead, relict of the late Mr. James Whitehead, whose death was chronicled in THE GUARDIAN a few days ago. She was 70 years of age, and had contracted pneumonia shortly after her husband's death to which she succumbed after an illness of eleven days. Two sons and five daughters survive her—the youngest of whom is Mrs. P. Conners of this town.

THE GUARDIAN records with sincere sorrow the death of Harry Brown, the only son of Mr. and Mrs. William H. Brown jr., of Back Road, Summerside, which occurred Thursday evening, after an illness of ten days with spinal meningitis. He was a bright promising little boy and his grief-stricken parents have the deepest sympathy of the community in their severe trial.

THE Farmers and Dairymen's Association of Bedouque, held their quarterly meeting in Lower Freetown Hall, Thursday afternoon. There was a fair attendance of farmers from the different sections of the surrounding country. A report was read by Mr. Charles Craig, of his interview with Mr. Rattenbury in reference to the pork business and the proposed factory at Summerside was discussed, almost all present favoring the project. The officers were re-elected and Messrs. James Carruthers, David Arbing and Charles Craig were appointed delegates to the Central Convention at Charlottetown.

THE meeting in Market Hall yesterday afternoon to consider the question of establishing a Pork Curing and Packing Company was a large one, the different sections of the county being represented by quite a number of influential farmers. Mr. William McNeill Simpson occupied the chair and Mr. J. Pond, Editor of the Pioneer, acted as secretary. Mr. J. M. Clarke, secretary of the Company read some correspondence from parties in the neighboring provinces who are either engaged or interested in pork packing establishments. After a good deal of discussion it was moved by Mr. W. A. Leard, and seconded by Mr. James Carruthers, and unanimously carried by the meeting that a Joint Stock Company be organized for the purpose of handling dressed hogs only. It was decided on motion that the shares be limited to \$10 each. Canvassers were appointed to canvass the meeting for shares. The result of the canvass was the subscription of 91 shares. The manner of conducting the canvass throughout the country came in for a good deal of discussion and the proposal of a good many schemes. It was finally agreed to leave the matter with the directors. The old board of directors were re-elected as follows: A. C. Rogers, President; J. M. Clark, Secretary; William Andrew, Edwin Darby.
