Canada Power & Paper

The common stock of the Canada Power and Paper Corporation sold at a new low level of all time this week when it sold at 15 1/2. People closely allied with this company could not offer any explanation for the decline other than that the selling was probably of a forced nature. The annual financial statement of B. A. Oil is now being prepared and from an earning standpoint the document will not be an impressive one but it will reveal that this company is in a strong liquid position. The recent price controversy has not helped the paper stocks with the investing public.

Public Interest Growing

It is a well known fact that the public is always more interested in a rising market than in one in which the trend of values is downward. The ability of the market to hold above the November average lows on its second reaction has apparently exerted a favorable influence. The writer notes the growing attendance in brokerage board rooms over the last week and this has become a matter of no little comment on the Street. Thus far this increasing interest has not resulted in any appreciable gain in outside business, but it tends to convince most observers that any sustained upturn in the market from this level will probably induce a return of the public in a fair way. Incidentally the large brokerage houses report that there is plenty of money seeking placement in the call loan market. International Nickel was the most active stock in New York on Wednesday. The turnover on the New York market, on the Montreal Stock Exchange, on the Toronto Stock Exchange and on the Standard Stock & Mining Exchange on that day aggregating nearly 262,000 shares. This tremendous turnover was so impressive that a great deal of buying was attracted yesterday. International Nickel is easily the pivotal stock of the Canadian stock exchange and an advance in this security does more to help sentiment in the general list than any other single factor. As is usual, the advance in "Nickel" has brought forward a number of rumors none of which appear to have any solid foundation. About the only thing that can be said about the move is that it was apparently engineered from New York, with indications pointing to a strong pool having taken a position in the security.
