**DENOUNCES MR.  
CARNEGIE'S GIFT**

**Sir William Sinclair Declares  
Gift to Scottish Universities  
Harmful to Students.**

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Sir William Sinclair  
of Victoria University, Manchester, in a  
speech at Aberdeen, voted the numerous  
severe complaints of the evil effects of  
Mr. Andrew Carnegie's gift of two million  
dollars to Scottish universities. He said  
that he had never met an Aberdeen  
graduate who did not denounce the influ-  
ence of the gift. It is feared from other  
sources that the provision whereby  
any Scottish student may apply to the  
Carnegie trust, fees has been interpreted  
with such latitude that even some col-  
ored students have received aid. The practical  
effect of the gift was that most stu-  
dents of the Scottish universities had  
drawn fees from the trust fund, many of  
them squandering the money supplied by  
their parents and concealing the fact that  
they received help from the fund. It is  
also asserted that the university pro-  
fessors, in view of the students preferring  
the donation, have raised their tutorial  
fees, and become less earnest in perform-  
ing their duties. It is declared that the  
Scottish student is losing his self  
reliance and capacity for study under  
difficulties, and that the whole nature of  
Scottish university training is undergoing  
a change for the worse.

**SULTAN'S TROOPS  
FACING RAISULI**

TANGIER, Dec. 28.—The Sultan's ma-  
halla this is the body of troops lately  
despatched from Fez, under War Min-  
ister Sir Mohammed Ghabli and Kaid  
Maclean, commander of the Sultan's body  
guard are now encamped at Almdalla  
within rifle-shot of Raisuli's  
stronghold. Everybody is wondering  
what will happen next. Despite circum-  
stantial stories that it is the intention  
of Raisuli and the Kabyles to resist  
to oppose the imperial troops, nothing of  
the kind has occurred. It is stated that  
Sir Mohammed Ghabli has summoned  
Raisuli to do homage for him as the  
Governor of Fez.

It is also said that the notorious brig-  
and, Vallente, and other tribal leaders  
have gone to confer with Raisuli.  
Natives say that the whole force is im-  
pregned with anti-European feelings, and  
if they are obliged to fight they will out-  
fight the foreigners. The natives insist  
that the attempt to install foreign police  
will be opposed anyway. There are  
rumors that French and Spanish troops  
are about to land to protect European  
and enforce order, but nothing definite  
can be learned.
