"Do you think Myra had a good effect on him?" Gaby went on, curiously probing into Ruth's thoughts to find the thing she was sure existed here.

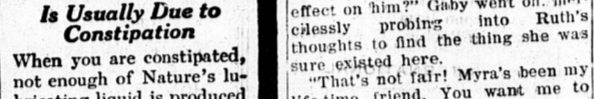
"That's not fair! Myra's been my life-time friend. You want me to say something against her—"
