HAVANA, May 5.—The House of Representatives today passed a bill postponing the municipal election from July to December, when they will be held concurrently with the congressional elections. A bill also was passed denying recognition to political parties based on racial lines. President Gomez signed both bills.

The postponement of the municipal elections is of importance as it indicates the extreme reluctance of the Government to hold elections under existing political conditions.

Public Notice

Notice is hereby given that all persons required under the provision of "The Act Respecting Births Deaths and Marriages failing to comply with the several regulations of same, (a synopsis of which is given hereunder) will be prosecuted and all persons who have neglected to send in Returns as required by the Act are hereby notified to do so within thirty days from date of this notice, otherwise they will be proceeded against after that date.

Section 9, provides that Returns must be registered within thirty days from the date of such Birth by parents &c. Section 16, provides that no minister or other person in Charlottetown, Summerside and Georgetown shall bury or perform any funeral service unless he has received a certificate under the hand of the Registrar stating that the particulars of the Death has been registered, and no undertaker or other person in said towns shall bury or assist in burying any body except under the same conditions imposed upon ministers or other persons.

Section 17, provides that the medical practitioner last in attendance during the illness of any person shall send a certificate, under his signature, of the cause of death, within forty eight hours, to the District Registrar, Blanks for which purpose may be obtained from the Registrar. Section 35, provides that any Householder, Head of Family, Clergyman, Physician or other person or persons required by this Act to report Births, Deaths, and Marriages, who refuses or wilfully neglects to do so within the time named, shall upon conviction, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty (20) Dollars and costs.
