Toronto And Montreal Stock Prices Advance

TORONTO, March 30—(CP)—All groups advanced steadily in active trading on the Toronto stock exchange today.

Western oils broke out of their narrow rut to show the widest advances on the board. Gains ranged up to 35 cents and out-numbered losses four to one. Anglo-Canadian was up 35 cents at \$3.95 and Okalta climbed eight cents to a new high at \$1.95 in active trading.

Base metals were in a two-way movement with gains barely outnumbering losses. Consolidated Smelters, International Nickel and Waite Amulet rose fractions while Hudson Bay declined 1-4 at 45 3-4.

A wide list of junior golds advanced on gains ranging up to 10 cents. McIntyre climbed to a new high at 57 1-8 in senior issues and closed at 57, a gain of 1-4. Several smaller golds dipped slightly to new lows.

The exchange's closing index showed gains up to 94.23, base metals 17 at 94.34, western oils 1.48 at 47.92.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, March 30—(CP)—Securities continued yesterday's slow upward movement in the Montreal stock exchange and curb market today.

Mines edged into lower ground during dull sales. Advances generally were confined to minor fractions, although a few leaders—especially in steels and papers—moved in a wider range.

Algoma Steel sparked the trade with an advance of 1-3-4 in early sales and held on to its sharp gain to close at 49. Stelco was up 1-2 points at 82 1-2 and the Preferred rose 1-2 at 81 1-2 while Atlas Steel advanced 1-4 at 11 3-4.

In the paper group, Howard Smith jumped 1-2 to 29 1-2 and fractional gains were noted on Abitibi Preferred, Bathurst, International Paper, Powell River, Price, Brown and Quebec Pulp Preferred. M. and O. Paper slipped 3-8 to 13 7-8 and Consolidated Paper was shaded at 17 7-8. Abitibi Common was most active and closed unchanged at 15 3-4.

Utilities, senior and western oils, metals and beverages followed the general firming tendency, but banks dipped slightly.

At New York

NEW YORK, March 30—(AP)—Nearly 2,000,000 shares of stocks sold in the exchange today but the price level barely budged.

Advances had a good edge over losses but changes either way ranged from fractions to only a point or so.

In Tuesday's high-stepping market, prices scored one of the sharpest average rises of the past year in the first response to news that margin requirements would be reduced to a 50 per cent cash basis from 75 per cent. The change was effective today.

Much of Tuesday's buying was said to have been inspired by the hope of another advance today.

Trading started off with a roar as blocks of 1,000 and more shares peppered the ticker tape. For a few minutes after the opening bell the tape could not keep up with its job of reporting transactions on the floor of the exchange.

Trading slowed considerably for a while and prices tended to fall back. In the last hour, however, demand revived and business started rolling again, with many issues establishing new tops for 1949 or longer.

Just before the final bell the price curve took another twist. Selling became a little more insistent and most issues closed slightly under the day's best levels.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks inched up .1 of one point to 64.4, tops since Feb. 4.
