### DO NOT WANT OFF-SIDE PLAY.

The Toronto Star says:—At the forthcoming meeting of the National Hockey Association in Montreal the advisability of the adoption of the rule permitting offside play in the centre third of the ice, as will be used in the Pacific Coast Pro League this winter, will be discussed, and it promises a lively battle.

The arguments pro and con regarding this style of play are many and varied. Those in favor of the rule contend that it will make the game faster by causing fewer delays for offside in mid-ice which they think do not materially effect the play to any extent. Also that it will make less work for the referees, inasmuch that one can take either end of the ice, where offside will not be permitted, and that in the centre third they can confine their attention to rough-house work only.

From the standpoint of the referees however, and those who oppose this style of play, there is certain to be a strong protest. It is certain to encourage loafing, or, in other words, the players will be pulling the inside home stuff, a lacrosse, which was too much in evidence in the N.H.A. games last winter. Last year it was very noticeable that the players loafed offside so persistently as to make the game drag listlessly along, while one player went after the puck and brought it back to centre ice when

the others would again either join in the play or "solder" while the lone rush was being made on the opposing goal.

If this new rule were adopted most of the players would camp in centre ice of the edge of their opponents' third line, waiting for the forward pass and the short dash to the opposing goal. It is plain that the game under these conditions would develop into a burlesque, as arguments with the officials would constantly arise as to whether the players making or taking the pass were within the charmed lines, and therefore free from penalties.

### WORKMAN'S LEGION OF HONOR

Eighty-four men and twenty-three women of Havre recently received silver medals of honor for thirty years' faithful service in one establishment. The medal of honor for employees and workmen was established in France by the decree of July 16, 1886. The institution is a form of decoration bestowed by the French government analogous to the Legion of Honor, remarks the American consul for Havre in a report to Washington, since those who have received the medal are permitted to wear on the lapel of their coat, or in the case of women pinned on their corsage, a narrow tricolor ribbon of red, white and blue. It is undoubtedly a factor in bringing about industrial solidarity, esprit de corps, loyalty to employers, and cordial relations between employers and their employees.
