ITALY WISHES GREECE WELL.

Hopes for Her Absolute Independence in Friendship with Allies.

ROME.—The measure against King Constantine could not be avoided," says a semi-official statement given out here. "Constantine placed himself in a position which left no other issue to have the country compromise by his personal policy. Any further resistance on his part would have forced the protecting powers to adopt more radical measures and to treat Greece as an enemy. "Everybody in Italy wishes Greece to enjoy absolute independence in harmonious accord with the right in the Mediterranean of the protecting powers. The hope is entertained that the new King will prevent the monarchy from being a disturbing element in the Allies' policy to inaugurate a regime of loyalty."

SAYS WITH AIRCRAFT WE CAN WIN WAR

WASHINGTON—Official announcement that the Government's aircraft program had been greatly enlarged, that definite plans had been made which would give America and her allies a permanent supremacy of the firm, and that the country must prepare to spend hundreds of millions of dollars for the construction of machines and the training of men, was made today by Howard E. Coffin, chairman of the Aircraft Production Board of the Council of National Defense.

Mr. Coffin's statement came as confirmation of the announcement made in the New York Times today that a thousand aviators a month for overseas service were to constitute the minimum mark set for the present, and that the first big expeditionary air force would move by September. "We may as well realize now," he added, "that the domination of the air will in all probability prove the deciding factor in the present war, on sea perhaps as well as on land. Military authorities of all the allied nations are agreed that unless the Allies can secure a preponderance of aircraft with which to overwhelm the German lines, the war probably will drag on for years, with a constantly increasing toll of lives."

Can be Done Within a Year

America, Mr. Coffin said, could not hope to send enough fighting men to Europe to end the war within the coming year, but by heavy expenditure could, he felt certain, overwhelm the Germans in the air and render them practically impotent by cutting off means of observation behind the lines of the allied armies. "A vast superiority in aircraft means the complete blinding of the enemy. If his machines are kept out of the air he has no facilities for sighting his long-range guns; he has no means of getting charts and photographs of the opposing lines or of preparing and meeting attacks properly, and his own communication lines are constantly subject to damaging raids and even to complete destruction."

Air Forces Now at a Balance

"In the present struggle between Germany and the Allies the fight for supremacy in the air is practically even. It is a nip-and-tuck race in both manufacturing and fighting. Germany has the supremacy in manufacturing organizations, the Allies in aggregate resources. There is reason to believe that neither alone can secure a definite and permanent supremacy. This is America's one chance for turning the scale within a year. She cannot equip and send over enough troops and military supplies to determine the war in that time, although all she can send will be necessary; it is in the air that the United States has its greatest chance to outmanoeuvre Germany.

"To do it, we must be prepared to spend hundreds of millions of dollars. We should not hesitate to sacrifice any number of millions for the sake of more precious lives which the expenditure of this money may save. We need not speak for the much greater amount of national wealth which an immediate expenditure of generous proportions made now may save. Great Britain's latest appropriation for aircraft alone was \$600,000,000. Her appropriation for the present year will probably approximate a billion. France has spent an equal amount on her air program. The United States cannot afford to be niggardly. Our resources are unbounded. We now have the program which will make it possible to get an adequate return from these resources."
