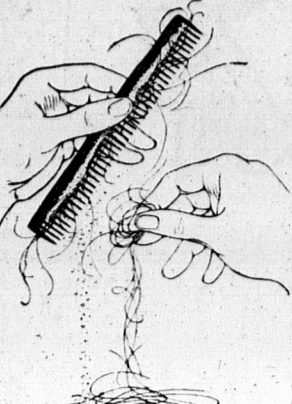

Cleric Held as Bogus Collector

PHILADELPHIA, March 7.—A country-wide search has ended in Moorestown with the arrest of Rev. John H. Danoc, a Syrian.

He is charged with having collected at least \$60,000 within three years while posing as a financial agent of the Near East Relief.

Danoc was recognized from a description on police files by Chief Bradshaw, of Moorestown. The chief arrested Danoc and wired Newark where a warrant was out for him.

According to Chief Bradshaw, Danoc has been travelling the country over soliciting subscriptions for the starving Armenians and other people in the Near East, representing himself as an agent sent out by the headquarters at Newark.

Danoc arrived in Moorestown a few days ago. He went right to work, according to Chief Bradshaw, and all went well until one of his victims who knew about the method of the Near East Relief and its representatives questioned him closely.

Danoc's answers were not entirely satisfactory to this man, who called the attention of Chief Bradshaw to the collector. Danoc was recognized as a fugitive from justice and was at once locked up in the Moorestown jail.

His methods, according to Detective McCarthy, were usually successful in obtaining money. He would have clergymen of one town write him letters of recommendation to those of another. In this way he moved across the country always well recommended.

It is understood Bishop Manning of the Episcopal diocese of New York, was one of the prominent clergymen victimized in this manner. Danoc is said to have obtained money also from the Morgans, the Colgates and other prominent New York families.

MORMONS IN TORONTO

TORONTO, March 7.—Sixteen Mormon missionaries have invaded Toronto, with the avowed purpose of starting a vigorous campaign to convert this city to Mormonism.

Under Rev. Neph Jensen they intend to put into operation within the next few weeks a house-to-house campaign in the day time, interviewing the women of the homes if permitted. Twelve of these missionaries are men, and four are women. All, with the exception of Mr. Jensen and his wife, are single, and all are between the ages of 20 and 25.

Because of the allegations that the Mormons are attempting to induce young girls to go to Utah to enter into polygamous marriages there, which allegations have received prominence in English and Canadian papers recently, The Star interviewed the band of missionaries on the subject.

The substance of the replies to The Star's questions was an absolute denial that polygamy is practiced by Mormons in Utah, or in any part of the world. In 1890, it was explained Wilfred Woodruff, who was then president of the church, issued a manifesto prohibiting the practice of polygamy which had previously been carried on with the church's sanction, and threatening with excommunication any member in future found guilty of disobeying the edict.

This manifesto was later published in the back of "Doctrine and Covenant", one of the four books of what the Mormons regard as divinely inspired scripture. But notwithstanding this, the original text of this book, which in one section encourages polygamy and teaches that it is God's law, has never been altered. It stands today, as it has always stood, a commandment enjoining men who would find favor with God to become "lawfully married."

BATTLE FOR ALASKA
