BRISTOL, N. B., May 6—(CP)—Two trainmen met death today as a result of derailment of a Canadian Pacific Railway freight train one mile north of the C. P. R. station in this Carleton County village.

The dead: Vinal Thornton, 58, of Woodstock, the conductor, and Robert Ketch, 22, Aroostook Junction, a brakeman.

The wreck occurred on a 100-foot stretch of track undermined by fresh water of the recently swollen St. John River.
