The two men, Russians, are said to have agreed that the loser should enlist for services in the European war.
 At five o'clock last evening Onders had drunk four quarts and unsteadily was about to open his fifth bottle when he fell unconscious, dying in a few minutes. Kuslus had drained three quart bottles when he collapsed. He is under the care of a physician.
