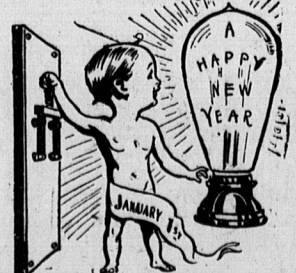

AGNEW FUR FARMS LTD.—The John Agnew Fur Farms, Ltd., have declared a dividend of 10 per cent and are sending out their cheques to the shareholders. They report that during the past season they had a very fair increase from their breeding foxes—there being thirty three pups from twenty pairs. They also received from the Windsor Silver Black Fox Co. one-third of a ranching contract, under terms of their increase, which was eight pups, giving 2-3 pups. They raise 11 thirty-four pups to maturity, losing through mortality about 5 per cent of increase. Three of the old foxes died early in October before the fur was in prime condition, but notwithstanding this they were able to dispose of the pelts for the sum of \$684.13.

FLOUR DUMP IN THE U. S.—A Minneapolis despatch says:—The Northwestern Miller's weekly review says following the startling drop of flour prices ten days ago quotations, have remained stationary with a very slack demand. Stocks are apparently large and mills are not pressing their offers as car shortage is making it hard for them to fill even old orders. Flour output is now growing less each week, though still keeping well ahead of last year's wheat crop. Last week produced about 43 per cent of capacity, southwestern group eighty per cent and soft winter wheat group about fifty-three per cent. Canadian flour at fifteen dollars per barrel is selling very slowly.
