May I express to you my sincere thanks and appreciation of the same. They are splendid potatoes and I would very much like to know what variety they are. I am trying to save a few for seed. My share of the car was three sacks and my family totals four. I am not complaining at the luck we have had, that is all in the game of life. For two years now my wheat crops have been a total failure owing to drought and grasshoppers, not even seed back and last summer on half an acre of potatoes I got exactly three pecks not one as big as an egg. You will readily see why your gift is so much appreciated.

CREAM OF MUSHROOM SOUP 1/2 lb. mushrooms 1 slice of onion, half inch thick 1 1/2 cups water 4 tablespoons butter 3 tablespoons flour 2 cups milk Salt and pepper 1/2 teaspoon tobacco or 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce. Wash mushrooms, peel and cut caps into pieces. Place skins and stalks out in pieces with onion in saucepan. Cover with water. Simmer 20 minutes. Strain. Melt butter, add mushroom caps. Cook gently until brown, blend in flour until smooth, add milk and liquid strained from stalks (approx. 1 cup) and seasonings. Stir and cook until smooth and thickened.
