Price Control Questions And Answers

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each month. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the War Time Prices and Trade Board.

**Q.** I read where canned salmon is to be on the market and rationed. I have not seen any yet, should the stores have stock now?

**A.** Canned salmon will be available to the public on and after Jan. 17. Owing to shortages in shipments all stores may not have their supplies by that date however. One meat coupon will entitle you to one quarter pound of canned salmon.

**Q.** Would you please tell me if there is anything in a ceiling price on nuts? All nuts seem to be high in price this year.

**A.** There is a controlled price on nuts. The Wartime Prices and Trade Board allows a set markup for the brokers, the wholesalers and retailers, based on the imported price.

**Q.** I bought some turnips in December and again in January and the price was higher in January. Is there a ceiling price on turnips?

**A.** There is a ceiling price on turnips. The price was 21 cents for 4 pounds in December. It was slightly higher in January at 22 cents for 4 pounds, as the price of such vegetables varies from month to month in the winter to take care of shrinkage and storage.

**Q.** How does one become identified with the organization of the Consumer Branch of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board?

**A.** Any organized women's group is entitled to select a liaison officer to represent it as a member of the Consumer's Branch Committee of the Board. Mrs. E. S. Coffin is chairman of the committee in this region and you can contact her for further information by writing to the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, Charlottetown.

**MATERIAL NECESSARY FOR FIRELESS COOKER**

(1) Outside case which may be heavy wooden box, (2) such as candy bucket, or a No. 1 new galvanized ash can, (3) Sheet asbestos, (4) Packing material such as sawdust, ground cork, excelsior, straw or hay, wool, cotton batting, fine shavings, paper torn small and crushed, (5) Inner container which should be straight-sided fitted with a tight cover, and of proper size that there is a 3-inch space on all sides and top and bottom for insulating material, (6) Cardboard or coated paper for "collar" to fit flush with top edge of inner container, (7) Tight fitting cover.

**USE OF FIRELESS COOKER**

The fireless cooker is admirably suited to foods that require long cooking in order to be made more palatable and to be more easily digested.

All foods cooked in fireless cooker must be heated through to centre before placing in cooker. Meats should be seared over high heat for at least 15 minutes; vegetables must be brought to boiling point and kept there for at least 5 minutes; stews, soups, apple-sauce, blanc manges, steamed pudding must all be preheated long enough to heat them through before placing in fireless cooker.

**ONION - CUSTARD SHORTCAKE**

Sauté 4 medium large onions in 3 tablespoons bacon fat until tender. Add onion, season with salt and white pepper.
