

PROVINCIALIST'S AWFUL DEATH

RESERVE MINES, C.B., Nov. 26.—One of the most cruel murders that was ever committed in this province was that which brought a thrill of horror to the residents of the Reserve Mines this morning when an Italian named Dominico Baptiste shot and instantly killed his friend Lewis MacLaren, of St. Peter's, P.E.I., as he sat at the dinner table at moon. MacLaren boarded with a family named McIntosh while the Italian lives in the other end of the house having married some time ago the daughter of Mrs. McIntosh.

They had a trivial quarrel, MacLaren, sat down to dinner, when Dominico entered the room walking straight up to where the Islander sat; his opponent's head and fired three shots in rapid succession instantly killing his victim. Three shots were fired from a 32 calibre revolver. One of the bullets entered the centre of MacLaren's forehead another entered his temple and a third crashed into his head near the bridge of the nose. Dr. MacKay who lives near was summoned but the victim was dead.

The deceased was a son of Mrs. John Campbell store keeper of St. Peter's Bay by her first husband. Deceased had worked with his mother in the store until about a year ago when he went to Cape Breton.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Kinkora Farmers' Institute, No. 50, held its annual meeting as advertised in the C. M. B. A. Hall at Kinkora on Monday, Nov. 13th, at 2 o'clock p. m. The President in the chair submitted his report of the doings of the Institute since its establishment in May last.

He expressed his satisfaction at the advantages accruing to the members in the business transactions of the last season, noting the provisions made for securing the best seeds available at the lowest possible prices; the interesting and instructive addresses given by Professors Ross and Clark of Charlottetown and Prof. Klinck of St. Anne College.

The Treasurer's report would show the disposition made of funds coming into our hands. He claimed that we should consider not so much what we have done as what we should do by uniting and co-operating, and urged all members present to work enthusiastically for the good of our Institute. In anticipation of the numerous benefits that must accrue through the working of the Central Institute just now established on P. E. Island every farmer in the locality, he claimed, should be a member of the Institute, that their interests would be brought to the notice of our representatives in Parliament through the Central Institute.

Speaking on the transportation question, which is now the all-important question for both farmer and merchant of this Province, he instanced one fact, viz: the freight rates on lambs from Kinkora to Montreal as follows:

From Kinkora to Summerside, a distance of 22 miles, 5 per cwt.; from Summerside to Point du Chene, a distance of 35 miles, 17 per cwt.; from Point du Chene to Montreal, a distance of 670 miles, 19 per cwt. Making in all 41 for a carriage of 727 miles. The striking feature of our handicap in transportation is that for 57 miles of that distance we pay 22c. per cwt. and only 19c. for the 670 miles under one haul. This is only one of the many grievances that the farmers of this Province have to endure. The only way to undo this state of affairs is for every farmer on P. E. Island to stand shoulder to shoulder and work as one man through the Central Institute for our own interests. As co-operation in buying seeds and selling lambs means dollars and cents to our members and more than compensated them for their small membership fees, so can we look upon co-operation along every other line in buying and selling as of the greatest advantage to our interests. We could buy our fencing material, lime fertilizers and household supplies, we could sell our hogs, potatoes, oats, etc., we could buy under the lowest tender and sell under the highest.

The President's report was on motion unanimously adopted.

The Secretary-Treasurer next submitted his report of the financial transactions of the year as follows:—

GERMANY PLAYS BULLY JOHN BULL NOT SCARED.

LONDON, Nov. 27.—World wide interest centres in Sir Edward Grey's statement, promised for today, dealing with the Moroccan crisis.

It is anticipated that this will be conciliatory, and the hope is expressed that it may lead to a better feeling with Germany.

As the truth becomes known concerning diplomatic moves of that uncertain period the newspapers are assailing their attacks upon the Government.

It has developed that Great Britain and France had reached a definite understanding and that Great Britain was prepared to rush one hundred and fifty thousand troops to the continent.

The great railroad strike was settled by the Government meeting the railway directors in secret conference, explaining that the country was on the verge of war, and appealing to their patriotism.

It is also learned that Germany preemptorily demanded the dismissal of Lloyd George, but the demand was not considered.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. If by proxy, he must be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each year from date of homestead entry, including the time required to expound homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

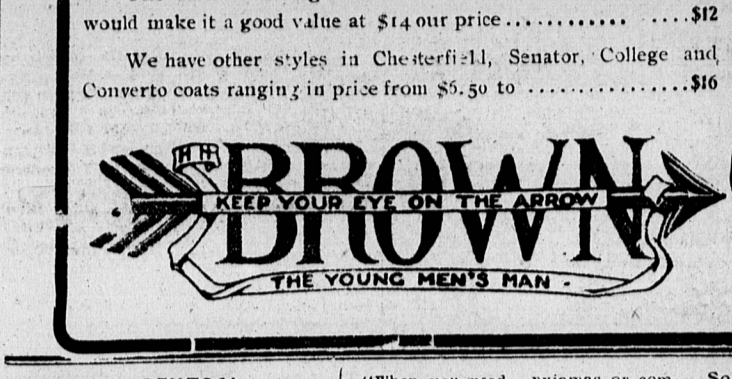
