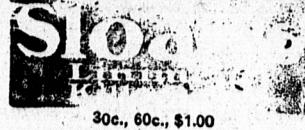

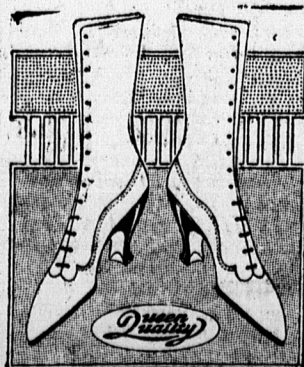

merchandise.—S.

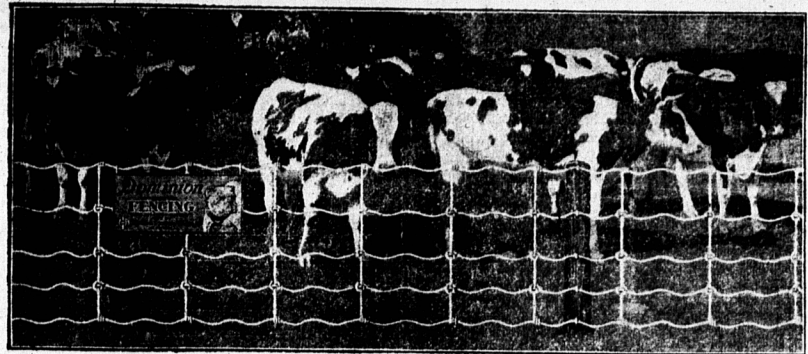
..*SPECIAL SERVICE will be held

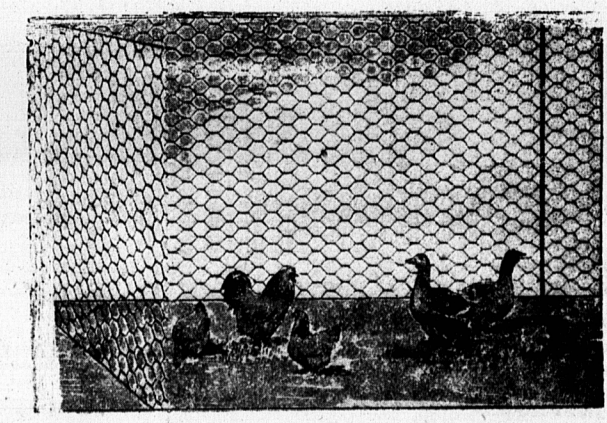
