Navy Minister in Great Britain

LONDON, Jan. 17 - (CP Cable) Angus L. Macdonald, Canadian Navy Minister, has arrived in the United Kingdom and is expected to reach London later today. Before leaving Canada Mr. Macdonald announced retirement of Admiral Foye W. Nelles, who had been chief of the Canadian Naval Mission in Britain. Admiral Nelles, on returning to Canada from London in November, reported he would discuss Pacific plans with Mr. Macdonald and Vice-Admiral George Jones, chief of the Navy staff.

Manpower Crises in United States

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17 - (AP) President Roosevelt asserted today that the need for men in the United States armed forces and war factories is now so extreme that voluntary controls will be necessary. He will send to Congress, probably tomorrow, a special communication requesting for recent demand for national service legislation, under which the government would be empowered to assign men to war-important tasks.

Secrety Will Shroud Next Big Power Conference

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17 - (CP) President Roosevelt today made it clear that the time and place of his next meeting with Prime Minister Churchill and Marshal Stalin has been arranged, but that it will be shrouded in secrecy until it is all over. It would seem certain from the President's reiterated declaration that no details of the conference would be known until it is over, that it will not be in Canada, as last meeting with Mr. Churchill was in Quebec last September, the second meeting in Canada's citadel.
