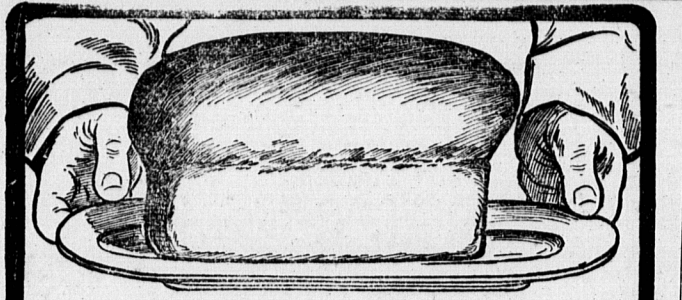
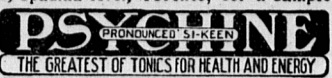

## HOW RICHARD MITCHELL CAME TO HIS DEATH

BOSTON, May 8.—That Richard F. Mitchell's injuries were not due to a fall but to "continued muscular force applied to the breast bone," was the opinion expressed today by Dr. Timothy Leary in the trial of Roderick C. McKenzie and Murdoch C. McGregor in the Superior Criminal Court before Judge Schofels, on the charge of manslaughter in causing Mitchell's death at Pierce Farm.

The doctor's positive opinion came as a sensational corroboration of the views of Medical Examiner William G. McDonald. That actual force had been necessary to produce the injuries which resulted in Mitchell's death is the belief of Dr. Leary.

Medical Examiner George B. Magrath said he thought Mitchell's injuries were the result of forcible compression of the chest from the front.

District Attorney Hill produced a

skeleton when he went on with the examination of Dr. McDonald, and the doctor pointed out on the skeleton all the fractures of the ribs that Mitchell had sustained by comparison.

"There is some degree of elasticity in the ribs under pressure?" asked Mr. Hill.

"Yes," replied Dr. McDonald. "It would therefore require considerable force to produce the condition of broken ribs you found in Mitchell?"

"Yes."

"Was all the breaking of the ribs in Mitchell's body done at the same time?" asked Mr. Hill.

"I should think so. The line of the breaks indicate that. I would say they were all broken at the same time."

Dr. McDonald testified that a person who had received injuries such as Mitchell would lose his strength.

"Could he walk?" was asked.

"Yes, an insane person could keep along a good deal longer than any other person, because of his being less susceptible to pain."

(Mitchell was a printer, and a native of Charlottetown.)

## SOUTHWEST MIRAMICHI LOGS RUN GLENT BOOM

CHATHAM, N. B., May 9.—Stream driving prospects on the Miramichi are particularly bright since last night's heavy rain, and word has been received that logs from the Southwest Miramichi were running into the corporation boom at Derby. This is exceptionally early and argues well for the whole drive coming out.

The Miramichi Lumber Company's big mill here started Wednesday with a full crew of men and the snowball starts on Monday.

The steamer Rognick was the first vessel to come up the river this year.
