THERE was a large assembly of dairymen in New Perth hall on Saturday night to discuss the subject of "Winter Dairying." The meeting was indeed worthy of the time and place. It was here in the early nineties that the people assembled to listen to the inspiring addresses of Prof. Robertson. It was here that experimental co-operative dairying received its baptism and here, after the lapse of a decade, the industry is still solvent, permanent, and flourishing. The discussion was opened by the President J. A. Dewar, who advocated the extension of dairying in winter, describing the favorable position—relative to freight rates and markets of the producer of butter, cheese and bacon, in comparison with the hampered farmer who exports the raw material. He was followed by William Cain, James A. Moar, J. F. Jenkins, Robert Kaneen, R. M. MacMillan, J. M. MacLean, R. G. MacLaren, and George Vandierstine with spirited speeches emphasizing the value of winter dairying, and the folly of shipping too much of the crude production of agriculture. The next meeting of the series will be held in the school house at Alberry Plains on Dec 28th at 6:30 p. m. Subject for discussion "How can the Government stock farm be made to render a greater service to agriculture."
