L. H. D. Foster, Marshfield, was the proud winner of nineteen prizes in Plymouth Rock poultry at the Provincial Exhibition in this city this year out of twenty-two entries. Of these there were eight first prizes, seven seconds and four thirds.

M. Labori, the French Advocate, as defender in the famous Dreyfus case, brother-in-law of Mrs. J. W. Foster of Charlottetown, has recently been elected barrister at Paris. This is a distinct honor, as out of three thousand barristers he is elected to represent them at any legal, state or social function.

The funeral of the late Thomas C. Caseley took place at Kensington, Sept 17th, from the home of his father Henry J. Caseley. The services at the house were conducted by Rev A. D. Strain, assisted by Rev Mr. Gough and Rev Mr. Johnston, also the choir of the Presbyterian Church, of which deceased was a member. Many tributes were paid to the late Mr. Caseley, showing the high esteem in which he was held. The funeral was very large and was headed by the Masons who conducted their beautiful burial service at the grave, before commencing their brother to his last resting place. Much sympathy is felt for the bereaved widow who is still in the Hospital at Saskatoon, Sask., suffering from the same dreaded disease typhoid fever, also their little son and the parents and family at home. H. F. Caseley who went West to take care of his brother and E. J. Caseley of Edmonton, Alta., accompanied the body of their brother home.

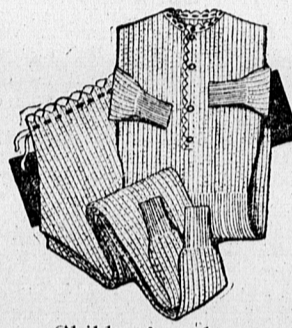
