RING OF STEEL SURROUNDS THE TEUTONIC ALLIES

Bad Weather Hinders Operations on Western Front. Russians and Italians Still Pushing the Offensive. Italian Gains a Very Important Factor in Ring of Steel.

(Special to the Guardian.) LONDON, Aug. 10.—Although bad weather is hampering the British and French manoeuvres in the west both the Italians and Russians are keeping up their strong offensives against the Teutonic Allies, respectively in Austria and Galicia.
