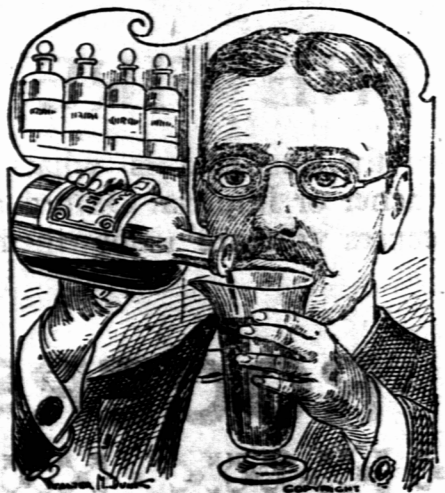

CARDIGAN ITEMS.—Miss Rita Owen of Montreal is visiting at her home in Cardigan after an absence of five years. Mrs. J. F. Corston of Halifax who has been visiting Mrs. Gunn of Cardigan left lately for the mainland. Cardigan school which has been closed some time for want of teachers has been fortunate in securing John McPherson of Uigy as principal and Miss Hilda Morson of Cardigan as assistant.—Miss Marie Macdonald and Miss Charlotte Stewart, both of Boston are visiting friends in Cardigan.—L. C. Gunn left a short time ago for Winnipeg.

REV. G. P. Raymond, Field Secretary of the Prov. S. S. Association visited the Bible School at Union Lot 33 on Sunday morning last. About forty were present and the lesson was explained to the school by Mr. Raymond in a most satisfactory manner. By blackboard illustration he showed that by disobedience Saul lost not only his crown but all that was most dear to him including his life at last. The church in the afternoon was comfortably filled when Mr. Raymond preached a most effective sermon on character building. It is needless to say that Mr. Raymond is always cordially received by the good people of Union.

EASTERN NOTES.—The weather keeps cool and dull, retarding the ripening of the crops, backward at the best, through the dry weather of June and July. No grain is cut here yet and won't be till nearly the middle of September, which may be a surprise to our farmers in the central and western parts, but other things being equal, the cool waters of the Gulf surrounding us on both sides, make our season about two weeks later than their's.—The first potatoes of the season were marketed by John Bruce, Red Point on the 3rd inst. he pronounces the quality good.—Among the visitors east this week were Jas G McLeod, of insurance fame, McGee of St. John and Miss Essory, City.—A fair quantity of mackerel is still hooked on Basin Head to East Point, but a body having struck the north side, the fishermen from there fishing on the south side have chiefly left for their own shores. The dog fish are more plentiful there than on the south side. There is a larger body of mackerel in these waters than there has been for a good many years their natural increase having at last overbalanced the drains made by the purse seine, and many of the seine are going out of the business during the lean years, but there is now a danger that unless restrictive legislation is enacted by the Canadian and American Governments in concert, an increase in the number of seiners and improvement in the destructiveness of the seines may reduce them to a pitiable remnant, similar to the proportions they occupied the last few years.—A few pollock have been hooked on the south side this season, a fish that is seldom seen in our waters, but found in abundance in warmer waters south of Nova Scotia and east of the United States.—At latest accounts the schooner "Citizen" was not floated though they are still working at her.
