**THE WIRELESS NEWS-BRIDGE.**

We are indebted to Marconi for bridging the Atlantic with an air-circuit for the transmission of news. Undoubtedly some messages of import have been sent and received in this way, but so far the desired and expected inauguration of a commercial news system by Marconi's methods across the Atlantic has been delayed. In view of the predictions and promises of a few months ago this delay is most regrettable, and so far it has not been explained in any satisfactory manner. The general public is still waiting hopefully for the difficulties to be overcome. We hope and believe that they will be overcome, but the situation indicates that some new or unexpected impediments have been encountered in developing the system.

In the meantime other workers in the field of wireless telegraphy seem to be nothing daunted by the delays that we are here experiencing. While Marconi is still experimenting between Cape Breton and Wales, DeForest, an American inventor is planning a system to project messages from California to Hong Kong by way of Hawaii and Manila. Dr. DeForest is a native of Iowa and a Yale graduate. His system differs from that of Marconi in important points and he claims that it can be worked at a much lower voltage. His project includes a large station at Manila, and then at Honolulu and a third in Southern California, with a small station at Hong Kong to work in connection with Manila. The estimated cost of the four stations is \$182,000, and it is expected that they will be well advanced toward completion by the spring of 1904.

Should this ambitious enterprise be

successfully carried out, and the cost is too insignificant to form the slightest obstacle, we are closely approaching the time when the broad Pacific Ocean will be crossed by messages speeding through the air, and the round world will be encompassed with the thoughts and greetings of men communicating with their fellows at unmeasured distances. The thought is inspiring in that it broadens the scope of man's dominion beyond what was dreamed in a generation past. To replenish the earth, subdue it and have dominion over it was the first great charter of the race. We are only now beginning to realise the extent of our God-given powers. For we shall not stop with wireless telegraphy. The goal is yet on and beyond. It may be that the next great stride will carry us far beyond Marconi as his marvelous achievements are beyond the belief of the men of a century ago.

**BEUZETTA, 2,063-4, IS DEAD.**

LEXINGTON, KY., April 8.—Beuzetta, 2,063, by Onward, dam Beula, by Harold, is dead at the Patshen Wilkes' Farm, from typhoid pneumonia. Beuzetta was twelve years old. She was bred by Edward Ayers, a poor Kentucky farmer, who won \$21,430 first money in the Kentucky futurity in 1894 and then sold her for 17,500.

**THE DOMINION REVENUE GROWS**

**Also the Expenditure, But the Surplus is Large**

**The Famous Barr Party in St. John Going West are Delighted—Lord Minto's Clever Brother Was an Editor.**

LORD MINTO'S NOTED BROTHER. OTTAWA, April 11—(Special)—Arthur R. Elliott, who has been appointed Financial Secretary of the Treasury, London, is a brother of Lord Minto, and has been editor of the Edinburgh Review. REVENUE STILL INCREASING.

The revenue of the Dominion to the 31st of March was \$46,597,241, an increase of over five millions over the same time last year.

AND THE EXPENDITURE ALSO. The expenditure was \$31,688,085, leaving a surplus of nearly fifteen millions, but nearly five millions was spent on capital. Outstanding accounts will make a big hole in the remaining surplus.
