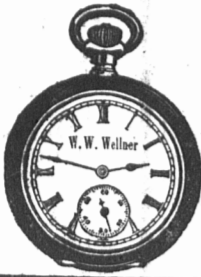

ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

GRAND Concert program by the 4th, Regt. Band at Carnival, Tuesday.

THE mails are still being conveyed to and from Sackville and Cape Tormentine by three teams each costing \$24 for the trip or a total of \$72 for the day. This would be sufficient to run the special train for which the public are asking between the two points and give us our mail nearly a day earlier.

GEORGE Holm, blacksmith and veterinary Surgeon, Victoria claims to be the champion pork raiser in his class in the Provinces. He has fed a hog for his own use for the past nine years, killing them when about six months old and they weighed when dressed as follows 265 lb., 277, 244, 274, 274, 312, 316, 300 and 262 lbs respectively. The breed of hog preferred by Mr. Holm is the improved "Nantes."

Russian Methods.
 Sven Hedin, in "Central Asia and Tibet," gives a striking illustration of the alertness and forethought of the Russian authorities. The explorer and author had been delayed at Merv. He says:

While studying the Russian railway time table it had occurred to me, why should I not run down and have a peep at the much talked of fortress of Kushik and the region toward Herat? My ticket said in plain and unmistakable language that "Dr. Sven Hedin was to be granted free passage for himself and his belongings over all the Imperial Russian railways, both in Europe and Asia."

But Colonel Skrydloff smiled significantly and taking out his pocket book drew forth a telegram from the minister of war, which he read to me, "In case Dr. Sven Hedin should contemplate going to Kushik please inform him that that line is closed to all travelers."

That was explicit. However, I thought to myself that the Russian military authorities did quite right to keep jealous watch upon a place of such great strategic importance as Kushik. I was told that the line was even closed to ordinary Russians and that nobody was allowed to travel by it except those who formed the garrison of Kushik.

A Land of No Money.
 "I have just returned from eastern Kentucky, where I went to inspect some timber," said L. A. Hotchkiss of Norfolk. "My principal operations were in Leslie county, and I was surprised to discover a community in the United States where money is unknown, or practically so. The entire business is done on the barter system. The country storekeepers exchange merchandise for anything and everything the natives have to sell and ship this motley array of products down to Catlettsburg, where the merchant has it placed in bank to his credit, when he orders more goods, paying for them with check. These merchants usually keep a small amount of money in case it should be required, but the natives, as a rule, do not handle a cent of cash from one year's end to the other. They barter among themselves and with the merchants, and when I bought lands the most of those who sold to me would not accept my money until the merchants assured them that it was genuine. Leslie county is in the heart of the Kentucky mountains and is very sparsely populated, which accounts for its primitive condition, but it is probably the only section of the United States remaining where the people do not know what money is."

It Was Ready in Time.
 A farmer in Illinois planned a coffin for himself thirty-five years ago and since that time spent many hours in trying to get a lazy carpenter to make it for him. The farmer cut the necessary lumber on his farm, hauled it to the carpenter shop, and there it stayed. Two years ago he insisted that the carpenter finish the work, and he took it up, working a little at a time, and only recently completed the job. The farmer died the week after his coffin was finished.

A GENTLEMAN belonging to Yonkers, N. Y. who was at the North Shore last summer for two or three months with his wife has written to W. H. Crookill, Provincial Librarian asking for a few copies of a government hand book descriptive of the Island (offering to pay for the same) and referring to the Island in very complimentary terms and concludes, "I believe that I could distribute eight or ten copies that they would be influential in inducing new people to visit the Island next summer. If you only had a first class hotel in Charlottetown it would be a decided factor in attracting a larger share of summer visitors and tourist travel."

In speaking of the recently derailed train the Sackville Tribune says: Two engines and a snow plow belonging to the N. B. & P. E. I. railway were derailed at what is known as Wm. George's crossing, near Upper Sackville last Tuesday. The train had fought its way to Cape Tormentine and was on its way back when the accident occurred. The passengers and mails were conveyed to Sackville with teams. Yesterday one engine was got on the track and it is hoped the other one will be put on today. Both engines are somewhat damaged, one having the front end broken in. The snow plow is also considerably damaged. Repairs to engines and plow will cost about \$400 and the train will probably not be running before next week. In the meantime the mails are being conveyed to Cape Tormentine with teams.
