### Entomology

#### THE SHEEP TICK

This insect is not a true tick but a wingless, parasitic fly, that clings tenaciously to the animal throughout its life and sucks its blood. ### New Brunswick Cabinet Changes

(C. P. by Guardian's Special Wire)

FREDERICTON, July 19—Addition of two members to New Brunswick's cabinet and three ministerial changes were announced yesterday exactly after Premier Dwyer's administration assumed office. It was the first shift in the cabinet since that time.

The new ministers are: Dr. E. Laporte, Dr. Laporte became Minister of Health and Labour; Dr. Laporte vacated the post left vacant by the death last February of Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberson; Attorney-General McNair had been carrying on the duties of this department.

Mr. Hennessey is now president of the executive council a position previously held by Hon. A. P. Patterson, minister of education, federal and municipal relations. Mr. Hennessey vacated the latter post to become minister of public works.

The announcement was made late yesterday afternoon following the second cabinet meeting of the cabinet. Government meetings on Saturday have been unusual except in continuation of one started earlier in the week. After the meeting of a week ago yesterday announcement was made of the province's newest bond issue, a \$4,000,000 bond issue, and subscribers within a few hours after the books opened. This was revealed as another step toward the completion of New Brunswick's program of highway hard-surfacing.

The end of this program is in sight under direction of the public works portfolio, said last night Premier Dwyer, who said last night that no further programs involving substantial capital expenditures were anticipated.

At the end of the last fiscal year Mr. Dwyer reported that revenues of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission had exceeded \$1,000,000 for the first time. Mr. Dwyer said that the commission was born Sept. 1, 1878, at Vercheres, Que. He was educated at L'Assomption College, Laval University and Ecole Des Medecins, Paris. Formerly Mayor of Edmundston and now chairman of the Edmundston School Board. Dr. Laporte has been a member of the Conservative Party since 1928 and is vice-president of the association medical P. A. D. N. He was first elected to the legislature when Liberals swept the Conservatives from office in 1933.

Mr. Hennessey is a native of Saint John and has practised law since 1917. An unsuccessful candidate in the provincial elections of 1925 and 1930, he was elected in 1935.

New Brunswick's provincial government as now constituted follows:

Premier and chairman of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission, Hon. A. A. Dwyer; Minister of Education, Federal and Municipal Relations, Hon. Dr. A. P. Patterson; Attorney-General, Hon. J. B. McNair; Minister Secretary-Treasurer, Hon. C. T. Richard; Minister of Lands and Mines, Hon. P. W. Pirie; Minister of Health and Labour, Hon. E. H. Laporte; Minister of Agriculture, Hon. A. C. Taylor; Minister of Public Works, Hon. W. H. Hennessey.

President of the Executive Council, Hon. E. J. Hennessey.

With the exception of the Premier, the President of the Council and the Minister of Education, the various ministers are \$3,500. The Premier receives \$2,400 as much in addition to the remuneration fixed by the chairman of the Power Commission, while the President of the Council receives a per diem allowance for attending cabinet meetings plus travelling expenses as in the case of other members.
