**OVERFLOW QUEEN'S COUNTY**

A Glace Bay despatch says:—Mrs. Joseph Brian, of Dominion No. 4, dropped dead at her home last evening about seven o'clock. She was walking from a neighbor's house a few feet away to her own home, and just as she reached the doorstep she sank to the ground and expired immediately. Death was due to her heart failure. The deceased was in the 68th year of her age and leaves a large family to mourn her loss. She was a native of Prince Edward Island.
