## AGAINST CHINESE

A Deputation Waits on Sir Wilfrid.

## THE WINNIPEG SCHOOLS

Sifton in Vienna--Ship Railway--To Marry a Duke--Big Contract.

OTTAWA, March 19.—(Special)—Sergt. Major Burns of the North West Mounted Police has gone to the Maritime Provinces and will recruit at St. John Halifax and Charlottetown.

Two hundred and fifty men will be secured from all parts of Canada.

### AGAINST ALIEN LABOR.

A deputation from the Trades and Labor Congress, had a long conference with Sir Wilfrid Laurier to-day and strongly urged legislation, particularly against the Chinese and to prevent Americans coming in and taking work from Canadians as has been done in British Columbia in the mining districts.

### A CHINESE BILL PROMISED.

Sir Wilfrid announced that the Chinese bill will be introduced and other work done this session that might help straighten out some difficulties.

### CANADIANS GOING TO EUROPE.

Hon. Mr. Sifton and wife reached London to-day and have gone to Vienna where Mr. Sifton will consult a specialist.

The Ontario Government will send Speaker Evantarel to Paris as Commissioner.

### THE SHIP RAILWAY SCHEME.

LONDON, March 19.—(Special)—The Board of Chignecto Marine Railway issue a circular calling for united action to get a reinstatement of the company or compensation from Canada and Mr. Provand will shortly visit Canada in this connection.

### CATHOLIC SCHOOLS AT WINNIPEG.

WINNIPEG, March 19.—(Special)—The Catholics of Winnipeg are petitioning the city to take over and run their schools as part of the school system of the city, and renting the present buildings, and maintaining the teachers, who are entirely subjected to the regulations of the public School Board.

### WILL MARRY A SPANISH DUKE.

NEW YORK, March 19.—(Special)—Sylvia Green, daughter of Mrs. Hettie Green, the richest woman in the world, will soon be married to Duke Dela Torre of Spain.

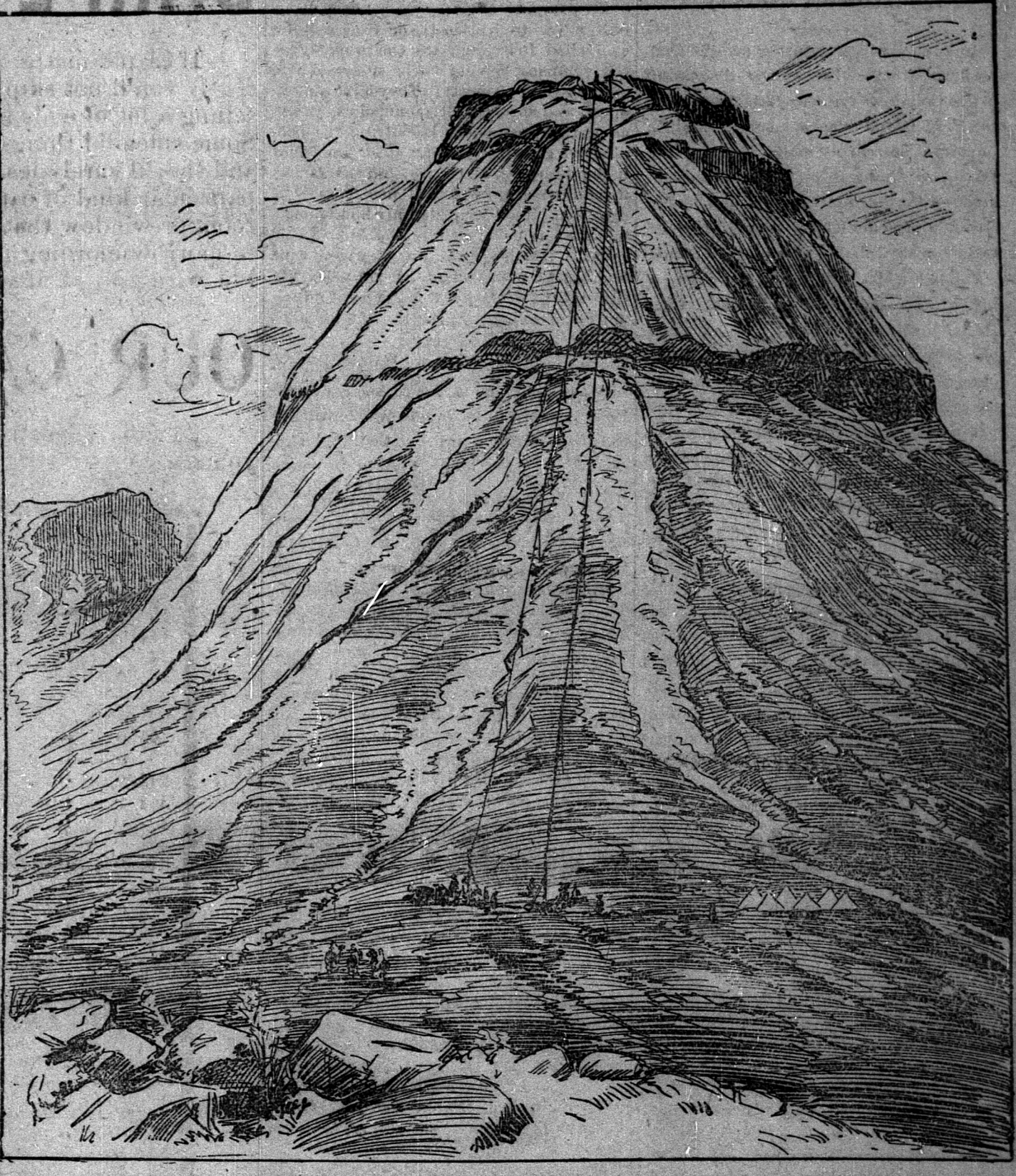

WITH GENERAL FRENCH'S COLUMN: RIGGING UP A CABLE HOIST ON COLESKOP.

The feature in the Colesburg district is Coleskop, a hill which rises straight out of the plain and commands the whole surrounding country. It had been held by us for some time and had been rendered historical by having two fifteen-pounder field guns placed on its summit. After the guns had been got up, the

question of sending ammunition to them and supplies to the gunners arose, and to save the wear and tear of carrying them up, the Royal Engineers thought they might make an ammunition lift up the kopje. This they did with their bridging wire, capable of standing a strain of two thousand pounds. They found the span

from bottom to top was 1,400 feet. (It will give some idea of the height to remember that St. Paul's Cathedral is only 404 feet high. Mount Royal is 750 feet high.) Two lifts of this span were made, and a continuous cable was passed round for hauling up ammunition and water, each load being forty pounds. —Graphic.

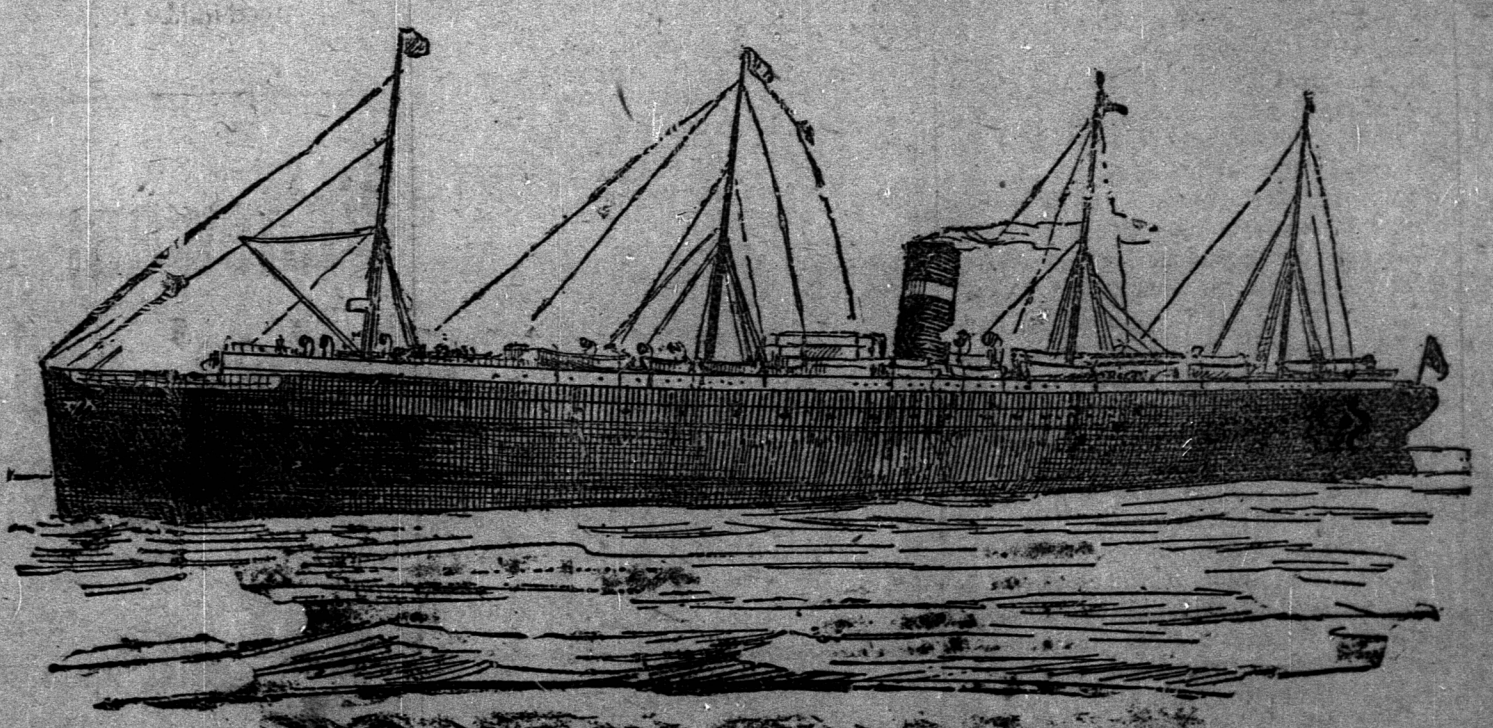
